At 4:15 p.m., Officer Gonzalez met with a complainant at the PD in regards to a civil matter. Information received.



Colorado County Sheriff’s Report

Ostomies Require Care & Precautions

More than 750,000 Americans are currently living with an ostomy, a surgically created opening or outlet through the abdominal wall. It is used for eliminating waste from the body. Ostomies may be needed for managing congenital anomalies, inflammatory bowel disease, cancer, or trauma. Although persons with ostomies can live normal lives, proper care of the ostomy is essential. Optimal ostomy care begins by eating right, taking prescribed medications, applying skin products appropriately, and reporting any complications to the physician. Eating right is especially important, as food can cause blockage of the ostomy, dehydration, and vitamin and mineral deficiencies. These complications can be avoided by eating a low fiber diet during the first few weeks and by always chewing food well.

Medication usage can also cause complications if not taken as prescribed. In general, medications that are liquid or that can be crushed are preferred. Extended or sustained release products and coated tablets may not be fully absorbed. Antibiotics, diuretics, and laxatives should be used only under the supervision of a healthcare practitioner, as these can alter the output from the ostomy. Consult your pharmacist or other healthcare provider for questions about all areas of ostomy care.

EARLY DETECTION OF ORAL CANCER IS CRITICAL

Oral cancer is diagnosed in 30,000 Americans annually—more than two thirds of whom are men. About 8,000 Americans die of oral cancer every year, and the number is rising, especially among people under 40. Many oral cancers are squamous cell carcinomas, which can spread quickly.

Tobacco use is linked to 70 to 80 percent of all cancer cases. Heavy alcohol consumption is another high-risk activity. Rough teeth, dentures or restorations that chronically irritate the soft tissues of the mouth, and poor oral hygiene, also put patients at risk for oral cancer. Your dentist should perform an oral cancer screening at each oral exam.
