## Emergency Farm Loans Being Accepted

Applications for emergency farm loans for losses caused by drought, excessive heat, and high winds that occurred on June 1, 2005 and continuing, are being accepted at the Farm

Service Agency (FSA) office located in Bellville, TX, Farm Loan Manager Tim Respondek said.

Colorado County is one of two in Texas recently named by the Secretary of Agriculture eligible for loans to cover part of actual production and/or physical losses due to drought, excessive heat, and high winds that occurred on June 1, 2005 and continuing.

Respondek said farmers may be eligible for loans of up to 100 percent of their actual losses or the operating loan needed, whichever is less.

For farmers unable to obtain credit from private commercial lenders, the interest rate is 3.75%.

"As a general rule, a farmer must have suffered at least a 30 percent loss of production to be eligible for an FSA emergency loan," Respondek said. Farmers participating in the Federal Crop insurance program will have to consider proceeds from those programs in determining their loss.

"Applications for loans under this

emergency designation will be accepted until October 10, 2006, but farmers should apply as soon as possible.

Delays in applying could create backlogs in processing, with possible delays into the new farming season," Respondek said.

FSA is a credit agency of the U.S. Department of Agriculture. It is authorized to provide disaster emergency loans to recognized farmers who work at and rely on farming for a substantial part of their living.

Eligibility is extended to individual farmers who meet U.S. citizenship requirements and to farming partnerships, corporations, or cooperatives in which U.S. citizenship requirements are met by individuals holding a majority interest.

The FSA office in Bellville is open from 8 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Stevens Nursing and Rehab Center of Hallettsville recently welcomed their new administrator, Gayle Shelton, a native of Kentucky.

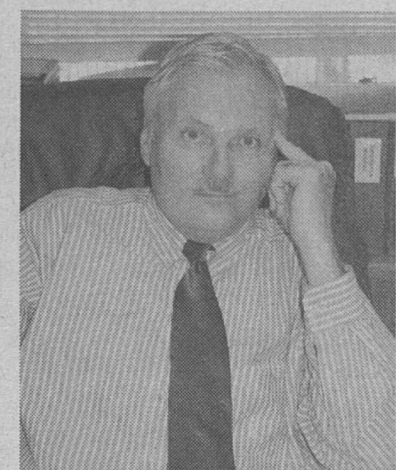
