Seven Sentenced In District Court

Seven individuals were sentenced in proceedings in Colorado County district court on March 6 before District Judge W.C. (Bud) Kirkendall.

—Kenneth C. Broussard, charged with possession of a prohibited substance in correctional facility, on Nov. 2, placed on five years probation, with deferred adjudication, \$1,000 fine, 400 hours community service and eight days in jail.

Broussard was also sentenced to a separate charge of possession of controlled substance, on Nov. 2,

and was placed on probation for five years with deferred adjudication and a \$1,000 fine.

—Reginald R. Bursey, theft by check of less than \$20,000, on Dec. 3, placed on probation for three years, with deferred adjudication, \$1,000 fine, and 240 hours community service.

—George Gonzales, possession of marijuana of between four ounces and five pounds, on Aug. 23, ordered on probation for three years with deferred adjudication, \$1,000 fine, six days jail, and 240 hours community service.

—Ken Demonthany King, probation revoked for possession of a prohibited substance in correctional facility on July 12, 2004, sentenced to two years prison.

—Sean E. Knebel, forgery financial instrument on Nov. 21, sentenced 15 months state jail.

—Jennie Millsap, theft of less than \$20,000 on Sept. 6, ordered placed on probation for three years with deferred adjudication, \$500 fine, and commitment to Central Texas Treatment Center for four months to 24 months.

—Jose Benjamin Sanchez, prohibited substance in correctional facility on Nov. 20, placed on three years probation with deferred adjudication, \$1,000 fine, 240 hours community service and nine days jail.

—Dusty Lynn Walker, driving while license invalid, six months deferred adjudication, \$100 fine.

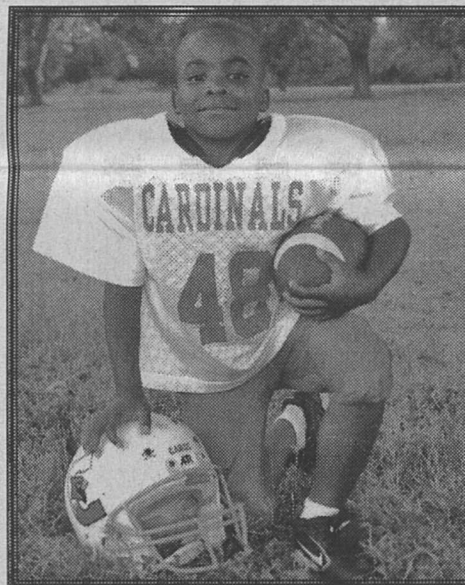
—Odin C. Wiley, possession of marijuana, 25 days jail.

Mango Split With Rum-Caramel Sauce And Macadamia Nuts

2 large ripe mangos, peeled and cut from the pit

1/4 cup packed brown sugar

1 tablespoon unsalted butter

1 tablespoon freshly squeezed lime juice

1/8 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1 tablespoon dark rum

1 pint mango sorbet

1 pint vanilla ice cream

1/2 cup sweetened whipped cream

1/2 cup macadamia nuts

2 tablespoons shredded coconut, toasted (see note)

Cut three of the mango cheeks into 2-inch-thick wedges. Cut the remaining cheek and side flesh into 1/2-inch dice.

In a small saucepan, combine the brown sugar, butter, lime juice, and cinnamon.

Cook over medium heat, stirring, until the mixture turns into a smooth caramel.

Mix in the diced mango, and simmer for 2 minutes. Remove from heat and stir in the rum.

Using four shallow soup bowls or coupe dishes, add 2 scoops of mango sorbet and 1 scoop of vanilla ice cream to each.

Divide the mango wedges around the ice cream. Spoon the warm caramel sauce over the top.

Garnish with whipped cream, macadamia nuts and coconut.

Note: To toast coconut, preheat oven to 325 F. Spread the coconut on a small baking sheet.

Bake the coconut for 5 to 6 minutes
