Danville Chadbourne Works At Live Oak Center

The Live Oak Art Center (LOAC) will present recent works by San Antonio sculptor Danville Chadbourne, opening March 18.

The exhibition will feature works in clay and wood, including both large and small-scale sculptures and new body of wall-mounted ceramic works.

The exhibition will also include several large-scale outdoor ceramic sculptures on the patio of the Art Center. The exhibit will run through May 6.

Known for his craftsmanship and use of primal materials such as wood and clay, Chadbourne's work is often likened to a body of cultural artifacts.

The visual and ritual impact of these beautiful objects is made more complex by their provocative, poetic and often paradoxical titles.

They are, in essence, monuments to irrational ideas and human impulses.

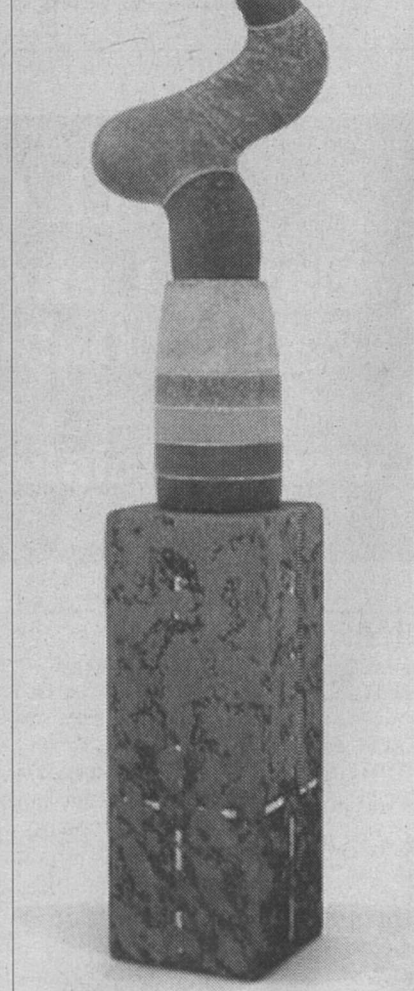
Danville Chadbourne was born in Bryan in 1949. He has a BFA from Sam Houston State and a master's degree from Texas Tech.

A resident of San Antonio since 1979, Chadbourne taught at the college level for 17 years until he devoted himself in 1989 to working full-time on his artwork.

Chadbourne has been featured in over 50 one-person shows and numerous group exhibitions including the San Antonio Botanical Garden, Beeville Art Museum and the Goldsberry Gallery in Houston.

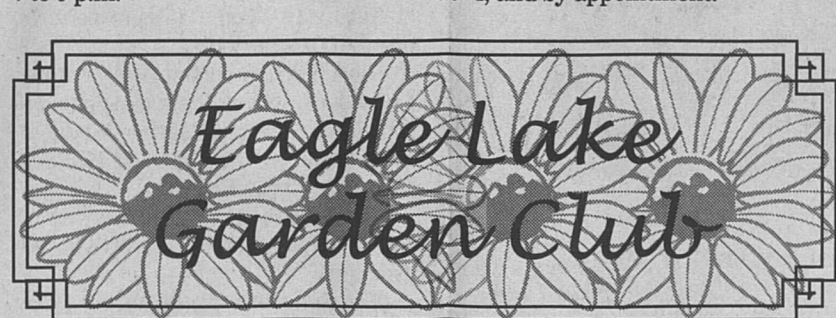
He was recently featured in the February issue of Ceramics Monthly. His works are included in many public and private collections across the nation.

The calendar says March 20 is the first day of spring but driving around Eagle Lake and the surrounding area we know spring is already here and been here for several weeks.

Some gardeners seem to garden all through the winter but I completely neglect mine (I don't like cold weather) during the cold months.

When spring suddenly arrives I look around at the disaster and try to fix it in a couple of days. BUT after a couple of weeks things began to shape up as the birds serenade me and I began to find color showing on this or that plant and finding life in a plant that I was just sure the freeze had killed.

I am fully energized and ready to tackle my disaster.

The lawn is a good place to start the spring clean-up.

Rake or pick up all the limbs and twigs scattered around and then fertilize with a complete fertilizer such as 15-15-15 being sure to water the night before and then after you finish.

When the azaleas finish blooming prune and fertilize. For a natural shape cut branches to the bottom, for a hedge shape cut the entire plant back.

Time to fertilize camellias also. When flowering shrubs and trees stop blooming feed and trim them. Trim just enough to tidy up their appearance.

When blooming bulbs finish, ap-

ply bone meal and for perennials and annuals apply a high phosphorus (the middle number) fertilizer.

Feed and spray (for Black Spot) your roses once a month.

Newly planted rose bushes should not be fertilized until they have bloomed the first time.

It is time to set your bedding plants and just enjoy, enjoy, enjoy this time spent in your garden.
