Three Civil Suits In District Court

Three civil suits were filed last week in Colorado County District Court.

On April 4, Schobels Inc. filed suit

against United Fire and Casualty Co. in a dispute over payment for wind and hail damages to the firm's restaurant in Columbus on April 10, 2004.

The suit claims that the insurance company's settlement offer on the claim for damages was inadequate. On April 7, Cary Dietzmann filed

suit against Oliver Hargrove in a dispute over the condition of a bulldozer. Dietzmann said he purchased the bulldozer on April 3, 2004, and claimed it was not in the condition that had been represented.

Relay For Life Captain Meeting April 18

All team captains for the Colorado County American Cancer Society (ACS) Relay for Life are strongly urged to attend the final team captain meeting at five o'clock on the afternoon of Tuesday, April 18, at the First Baptist Church in Columbus. At that meeting, captains will learn of final plans for the event, including when and where to pick up T shirts.

As of last Friday, 35 teams and 137 cancer survivors have registered for this year's event. The Relay for Life raises money to help fight cancer and honors cancer survivors, caregivers, and those who have died of the disease. It is scheduled to begin at 6 p.m. at the Columbus High School (CHS) football stadium on Friday, April 21.

After the opening ceremony, the cancer survivors who are present will take one turn around the track. Later, the luminarias will be lighted, the CHS Steel Pan Band and The Chosen will provide live music, and a series of games will be played on the infield. All the while, the relay teams will walk the track and the concession stand will be open.

The ACS's Relay for Life program was inspired by the efforts of one man in Tacoma, Washington, a surgeon named Gordy Klatt. Klatt wanted to raise money for his local ACS office. He was a marathon runner, so in May 1985, he ran and walked around the track at a local university for twenty-four hours. People contributed money to circle the track with him. Nearly

300 people turned out for the event, and Klatt raised about \$27,000 for the society.

Months later, he organized a committee to plan a similar event, this one to feature teams. That event, called the City of Destiny Classic 24-Hour Run Against Cancer, was held in 1986 in Tacoma. Nineteen teams participated, raising \$33,000. Many of the teams pitched tents, and a spirit of camaraderie and fun prevailed. The nationwide Relays for Life grew from there.

The two previous Colorado County relays were enormous successes. They raised more than \$200,000, and those who attended had fun.
