Agriculture Waste Collections Planned For April, May

Five Agricultural Waste Pesticide Collections are scheduled for April and May in central and southern Texas. These cleanup events are free to participants. Each cleanup will be from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. The following items will be ac-

- cepted:
- Empty, triple-rinsed plastic containers;
- Used motor oil (except that from oil-changing businesses);
- Used motor oil filters (limited to two 55-gallon barrels per participant);
- none from oil-changing businesses);
- Auto batteries;
- Agricultural pesticide wastes; and
- Household hazardous wastes, such as paints, thinners, antifreeze, aerosol cans, mercury thermometers, photographic chemicals, herbicides and cleaners.

Geisler To Host Radio Show For Syndication

Local radio personality Carl Geisler has teamed up with a Nashville marketing firm to distribute his new daily radio program called, "Today In Country Music History". The show will debut on approximately 100 radio stations nationwide on May 1, with a goal of approximately 300 stations by the end of the year. "The name of the show describes

what we do," Geisler said. "It will run anywhere from 1-2 minutes and will be followed by a song that relates to an event that I mentioned on the show." Geisler said it is the same thing he does live each morning on KULM, but it will be recorded for other stations across the country. The show will air seven days a week. "I've been developing the show and in negotiations with a company called "Impact Radio Networks" in Nashville for more than a year, and I'm very happy it is finally going to happen," said Geisler. "I'll be in Nashville next week recording the shows that will air in May." Geisler's company, Geisler Radio, will produce "Today In Country Music History".
