

Eagle Lake Police Department Report



Comacho Deployed By U.S. Air Force

Air Force Staff Sgt. Johnny Camacho has deployed to the U.S. Central Command Air Forces Combined Air Operations Center in Southwest Asia to support the missions of Operation Enduring Freedom, Operation Iraqi Freedom, and Horn of Africa.

Operation Enduring Freedom is the official name given to anti-terrorism military operations involving U.S. troops and allied coalition partners. Reserve component members from all branches of the U.S. armed forces have been mobilized, activated and deployed along with active duty members to support the war against global terrorism.

Mission objectives encompass combating the international terrorist network or regime forces outside the borders of the United States. U.S. troops serve in South and Southwest Asia, Central Asia, the Arabian Peninsula, islands in the Pacific, and in various other countries.

Operation Iraqi Freedom is the official name given to military operations involving U.S. and coalition forces efforts to liberate the Iraqi people, preserve Iraq as a unified state, keep its territorial integrity intact, and help the Iraqi people begin the process of economic and political reconstruction. Active duty, reserve, and National Guard members from all branches of the U.S. armed forces are participating in the operation.

The mission of U.S. troops in Operation Horn of Africa is to detect, disrupt and defeat transnational terrorist groups in the region and to

support coalition partner efforts to deny opportunity for re-emergence of terrorist networks in the central, eastern Horn of Africa.

The sergeant is a cable and antenna maintenance assistant supervisor regularly assigned to the 2nd Communications Squadron, Barksdale Air Force Base, Bossier City, La.

He is the son of Johnny and Margaret Camacho of Charter St. of Columbus.

Camacho graduated in 1992 from Sealy High School and received an associate degree in 2002 from the Community College of the Air Force.
