


Rice FFA Holds Annual Awards Banquet April 27



THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A DEBRIDEMENT AND A REGULAR CLEANING

A regular cleaning is the removal of plaque, calculus, and stains from tooth structures. This is accomplished by using dental instruments that scrape away deposits from teeth. An electric device, called an ultra-sonic or sonic scaler, may be used. This deposit removal is performed on tooth structures that have not been affected by bone loss, periodontal disease or infection. A regular cleaning is recommended for persons who do not have dense deposits.

A debridement is recommended for persons who do have dense deposits. It is the removal of heavy plaque and calculus that interferes with the ability of the dentist to perform a comprehensive oral evaluation, a preliminary procedure that does not rule out the need for additional procedures. Simply put, a debridement is necessary when dense plaque or calculus is present. Dental instruments and electric devices may be used, but the amount of time needed to complete the procedure, as well as the difficulty and extent of the procedure, are different.




