

Foster Wins Silver Medal At State Track And Field Meet In Austin

The Lady Raiders Cunneisha Foster completed at the 2006 State Track Meet this past weekend in Austin. On Friday, Cunneisha participated in

the girls 3A Long Jump, jumping 17'3". She took 6th place in the event. Not being satisfied in the Long Jump, Cunneisha still had the Triple Jump to compete in on Saturday. This event

is her favorite out of the two. Cunneisha's first jump in the Triple Jump was a 37'0". On her second jump she had a scratch. Her third jump was a 38'0" jump which would put her in second place. This jump would keep Foster

Blinn Offering Spanish For Law Enforcement

Blinn College, through its workforce education program, has been approved by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Education to offer three Command Spanish® classes specific to the law enforcement profession, Brian Burk the program director has announced.

Survival Spanish for Law Enforcement Officers, Survival Spanish for 9-1-1 range from 12-24 hours in length and may be customized to meet an agency's needs based on previous experience. The classes qualify for annual training credits required to satisfy applicable law enforcement continuing education requirements.

Blinn is approved to provide the training to any state, county or city law enforcement agency or jail facility within the college's service area

"It allows these agencies to satisfy their continuing education requirements while learning much needed Spanish language skills," said Burk "These classes can be designed to meet specific needs, therefore we ask the agencies to contact us about scheduling a class."

No prior knowledge of Spanish is necessary to enroll in any of the classes.

Survival Spanish for Law Enforcement Officers is a program designed to provide non-Spanish-speaking police officers with functional skills in Spanish and provide for better communication in the work place. The program utilizes phonetic encoding to address the most important Spanish questions and phrases critical to police work.

Survival Spanish for Jail Facilities is designed for non-Spanish-speaking correctional officers and jail support staff to provide functional Spanish language skills needed in city and county jails to remove communication barriers.

Emergency Spanish for 9-1-1 is a three-day workshop that prepares dispatchers to respond to calls relating to most medical, police and fire emer-

gencies. The instruction is provided by Command Spanish® personnel.


