 the middle of a 10,000 acre reservoir would not be worth much.
 "We're seeing the beginning of the water wars," Hurr predicted.
 Heffley also read a proposed mission statement, which said in part:
 "We are organizing as a group to do everything in our individual and collective power to defeat the idiotic and ill-conceived scheme by LCRA-SAWS to send Colorado River water to San Antonio via a pipeline, to pump the Evangeline Aquifer if river water is insufficient, to damage Matagorda Bay, to take our land and not pay us appropriately for its value and to decrease the values of our mineral estates."

Heffley said representatives of the group plan to attend a meeting of an advisory group for the water project on Thursday, June 22, in Austin.
 Colorado County Commissioner Doug Wessels, who represents much of the area where the proposed reservoirs would be located, said he plans to introduce a resolution in opposition to the project to Commissioners' Court to consider at their first meeting in July.
 After the meeting, Heffley said he expects the directors to meet again in about two weeks. He said the group needs to adopt a name and he said he feels it needs to setup a website.
 Heffley noted he will not be one of the directors, but will assist on the political action subcommittee. He noted his comments reflect his views as a private citizen and do not represent the city of Columbus.
