Colorado County Courthouse Report

Twelve Sentenced In District Court

Twelve persons were sentenced in Colorado County District Court on Thursday, June 22, in proceedings before District Judge Dwight Peschel.

They included:
-Chad J. Brown, sentenced to 12 months in the county jail for burglary of a building on May 24.

-John D. Colletti, sentenced to 12 months state jail for burglary of a building on Dec. 28.

-Manuel Stephen Ebarra, sentenced to 10 months state jail for burglary of a building on May 21.

-Adan Juarez, probation revoked for forgery of a government instrument on April 24, 2003, and sentenced to six months state jail.

-Billy Kazmir, probation revoked for felony DWI on July 14, 2002, and sentenced to four years in prison.

-Royce Ray McMillian Jr., three cases of indecency with a child on Oct. 30, 2005, sentenced to three years in prison.

-Louis Wayne Murrell, possession of a controlled substance on Dec. 27, ordered placed on probation for four years, with deferred adjudication, a \$1,000 fine and 240 hours of community service.

-Larry Wayne Otradovsky Jr., delivery of a controlled substance on Oct. 1, 2005, sentenced to five years in prison.

-Bradley F. Parker, burglary on Dec. 28, 2005, sentenced to 18 months state jail. Also, Parker was sentenced to four years for possession of a firearm by a felon on Dec. 28, 2005 and for possession of a prohibited substance in a correctional facility on Dec. 30, 2005.

-Rodney Jerome Rodriguez, robbery on March 2, ordered placed on probation for three years, with deferred adjudication, \$250 fine and 240 hours community service.

-Richard Lloyd Thomas, possession of a controlled substance on April 1, 2005, ordered placed on probation for three years, with a \$1,000 fine and 240 hours of community service.

-Vera Stovall Williams, possession of a controlled substance on Dec. 10, 2005, sentenced to five years in prison.

Three Civil Suits In District Court

Two civil suits were filed in Colorado County District Court on June 26.

LVNV Funding, LLC, filed suit against Janie M. Douglas in a dispute over payments on an account. The suit claims that \$4,645 is owed.

In a separate suit, Longbeach Mortgage filed for an order of foreclosure against Robert C. Waddle involving payments on a loan.

The suit claims that payments by Waddle on a mortgage note are in default and \$5,000 is payable.

Also on June 26, prosecutors filed suit to seek forfeiture to the state of a 2000 Chevrolet Lumina. The suit claims the vehicle was seized as contraband by Columbus Police Officer Tomas Ramirez on June 19.


The suit claims Oscar A. Garza was in possession of the vehicle at the time.


