Schobel Football Camp Slated In Columbus

COLUMBUS — Three NFL players from Columbus, the Schobel brothers, Aaron and Matt, along with cousin Bo Schobel, will present the first-ever Schobel Football Camp Friday, July 14 at Memorial Stadium with all proceeds to benefit the Columbus Ballparks Renovation Inc.'s Football Complex Project.

Besides the three NFL stars from Columbus, the Schobels have invited former collegiate teammates to assist with the camp.

Aaron, a defensive end for Buffalo, currently ranks as one of the top sack leaders in the American Football Conference while Matt, a tight end, recently signed a free agent contract with the Philadelphia Eagles. Bo is a defensive end

for Tennessee.

"We will feel very fortunate to be able to work with Mr. (John H.) Massey and Columbus State Bank on this project," said Matt. "It is our way of giving back to the community that supported us through our high school careers."

"It is going to be a fun day for the kids and we are very much looking forward to it."

"We also want to thank the community for its support as we began making plans for this camp. Without hesitation, everyone has stepped up and done everything asked of them. It feels good to have the whole community working together for such a worthy cause," he said.

The one-day camp, priced at \$30 per camper, will be divided

into two sessions. The morning session from 8 a.m. to noon will be for fifth through eighth-grades as of the 2006-07 school year while the afternoon camp has been earmarked for freshmen through seniors.

The campers also will be split up by positions — quarterbacks, running backs, wide receivers, tight ends, offensive linemen, defensive linemen, linebackers and defensive backs.

"The campers will receive instruction in all phases of the game," said Aaron. "We will include passing, rushing, receiving,

blocking, line play, and pass and run defense."

"We want to teach these campers some of the techniques that have helped us in our careers since we left Columbus and, like Matt said, have some fun in the process," said Bo.

Campers are expected to provide their own athletic attire and must turn in the camp liability form in order to participate.

San Jacinto Monument Reopening

The San Jacinto Museum of History is pleased to announce that following a period of renovation, the staff has moved back into their offices in the monument in the San Jacinto Battleground State Historic Park.

The museum will be partially open to the public with a staggered schedule for the complete re-opening this month. Texas Historical Commission (THC) commissioner Sarita Hixon serves on the Board of Trustees for the museum, whose permanent gallery represents 400 years of Texas history.

The museum is operated by the San Jacinto Museum Association — a non-profit organization — in conjunction with the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.

Commemorating the historic battle of July 21, 1836 that ended Mexican rule over Texas, the museum seeks not only to honor those who fought, but also to re-emphasize the history of Texas and the Spanish Southwest.

The museum store and the award-winning presentation of "Texas Forever! The Battle of San Jacinto" are currently open to the public.

The observation floor of the monument, at 489 feet high, will be opened in August for visitors to experience an unforgettable view.

Located near Houston in the Pasadena/Deer Park/La Porte area, the San Jacinto Battleground State Historic Park allows visitors the opportunity to peruse the grounds, the marsh boardwalk and the Battleship TEXAS.

They were sponsored by Colorado County Farm Bureau (CCFB). They joined approximately 275 high school juniors and seniors from more than 150 counties across the state.

The purpose of the conference is to provide the students with a better understanding of their American heritage and the capitalistic free enterprise system, according to Gerald Heintschel, president of the CCFB.

Vernie R. Glasson, executive director of TFB, presented "Farm Bureau-Your Host" after the students were welcomed to ASU by a university representative. Coleburn Davis, TFB associate director of Organization Programs; Hana Manal, 2005 Miss TFB; and Will Echols, 2005 Speech Contest winner, presented, "Farm Bureau Scholarship Opportunities."

During the weeklong event, students discussed topics such as the free enterprise system, constitutional government, managing money, Americanism, leadership and goal setting. Students are encouraged to meet with school and civic groups upon their return home to share the information and knowledge they have received.

Speakers and their topics

included: Dr. Russell Dabbs, Lubbock Christian University "Basics of Free Enterprise"; Ronald Trowbridge, former assistant dean at Hillsdale College in Michigan, two part sessions on "The Constitution"; and Gary Evans, Lubbock Christian University and a registered investment advisor, "Managing Money."

Students also participated in a panel discussion led by Trowbridge followed by a question and answer session on "Our Rights, Our Freedom, Our Responsibility."

In addition, the students took part in a program called, "Congressional Insight", which allowed them to simulate a Congressional office and election.

Students were captivated on Tuesday evening by Chad Hymas of Utah, a motivational speaker, sharing his personal message of "Overcoming Adversity." Damon Whaley, former TFB Talent Find Contest winner, provided special entertainment. Damon is an accomplished musician, comedian and impressionist. A patriotic program was presented at Thursday evening's banquet.

Students who complete the Youth Leadership Conference and have given a speech on free enterprise to a least five groups, have taken the first step toward qualifying for the Free Enterprise Speech contest, which awards more than \$19,000 in scholarships.
