TxDOT Working On Hurricane Fuel Plan

The Texas Department of Transportation, the Texas Oil and Gas Association and the Texas Petroleum Marketers and Convenience Store Association are working together to ensure that fuel will be available to the greatest extent possible should there be another emergency evacuation called for the Texas Gulf Coast.

As part of this effort, TxDOT is displaying messages on coastal highways on dynamic message signs advising coastal residents to keep their gas tanks full. These types of messages have traditionally proven to be a valuable tool to inform the public about traffic safety and hurricane preparedness issues.

"We hope to provide an effective reminder to coastal residents about the need to be cautious during hurricane season and to watch their fuel gauges," said Zane Webb, TxDOT's director of maintenance. "This will be a critical part of our state's overall plan to improve the availability of fuel during an emergency. Any emergency evacuation can only be successful if drivers start out

with a full tank of fuel."

TxDOT and its private sector partners recommend that coastal residents fill their tanks when they get to half empty during hurricane season (June 1 - November 30) and keep their tank close to full when a storm enters the gulf. Should fuel supplies become low along evacuation routes, TxDOT will provide signage to indicate the next available fuel location.

"The Texas fuel and petroleum marketing industry is committed to making sure that fuel is available during any emergency evacuation to the greatest extent possible," said Wade Upton, State Fuel Coordinator. "However, the most important first step a citizen can take is to purchase fuel for their evacuation vehicle early and keep their tank topped off should a storm threaten their area. The greatest fuel storage capacity on the gulf coast is the sum of the individual vehicle fuel tanks of our residents. Our hope is that our coastal residents will pay particularly close attention to these messages being displayed by TxDOT on area highways."

DENTAL TREATMENT DURING PREGNANCY

Most dental treatment can be safely completed during pregnancy. Despite the extremely low radiation of dental x-rays, routine check-up x-rays are usually avoided during pregnancy if the expectant mother has received routine dental care, and is in good dental health. Most antibiotics used by dentists during pregnancy do not put the unborn child at risk. Dental pain should be treated with acetaminophen (Tylenol) in most cases.

The best time for dental treatment during pregnancy is in the second trimester. Elective dental treatment such as cosmetic dentistry should be postponed until after the child is born. Always consult your obstetrician if you have any questions about medications or treatment.
