## Special Goose Season May Be Canceled

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department has announced that the Special Snow Goose Season held from the end of January through March may be cancelled. Harvest surveys indicate the Conservation Order has become less effective in Texas during recent years with declines in both hunter participation and light geese harvest, thus TPWD is proposing the Special Snow Goose Season be cancelled.

Local business owner Tim Kelley said that businesses in the City of Eagle Lake benefit from late season hunters. "Citizens of Eagle Lake need to let TPWD know that we do not want the Special Snow Goose Season to be cancelled," said Kelley. Public comment can be made to Dave


