Colorado County Sheriff's Report

The Colorado County Sheriff's Department reported the following calls and cases for the period ending July 20.

Friday, July 7

On arrival, it was discovered that two juveniles had thrown objects off the overpass. After the investigation, no damage was sustained by any vehicles and no charges were filed. Case closed.

County Tax Decrease Possible

Colorado County Auditor Raymie Kana said she is projecting a county tax rate of 41.89 cents per \$100 valuation for county commissioners to consider for the coming county fiscal year, a slight decrease from the current rate of 42.758 cents.

Kana said the rate is slightly below the county's tax rollback rate of 41.894 cents. If the adopted tax rate exceeded the rollback rate, votes could start procedures to rollback the tax rate.

Because of an increase in the county's property values Kana estimated that county will receive \$535,000 in additional revenue at the proposed rate. According to figures from the county appraisal district, the county's adjusted tax base, after subtracting the value of new property is \$1.383 billion.

Kana said she expected commissioners to discuss the rate at their meeting on Aug. 14. She said Sept. 11 is tentatively scheduled as the date to adopt the budget.
