up of youth between the ages of 8 and 10. All of these are members of the Frelsburg 4-H Club.



Police continue to search for a common denominator in the five cases, hoping to draw a link to the producer of these bills.

"Many of those involved in the incident deal only in cash and are not part of the credit card society. This makes tracing the path of the bills very difficult," Lattimore said.

The Secret Service continue to assist the Eagle Lake Police Department in the investigation.

"We'll handle the actual passing of the bills on the state level, with charges of forgery by passing. If we manage to discover the source of the counterfeit bills, the Secret Service will be called in," Lattimore said.


Turn Your Piggy Bank Into Cash!
