

Eagle Lake Police Department Report

Patsy Cravens To Appear At Nesbitt Library

In July, the University of Texas Press published a very substantial addition to the literature on Colorado County, Leavin' A Testimony: Portraits from Rural Texas by Patsy Cravens.

On Saturday, August 19, at one o'clock in the afternoon, the Nesbitt Memorial Library in Colum-

bus will host a reception for Cravens. Cravens will be present to meet the public and to autograph copies of her book. Admission is free. The book will be offered for sale at a slight discount. Bill Stein, the library's director, noted, "I cannot imagine anyone who is interested in Colorado County and

its history who would not want to buy this book."

About twenty years ago, Cravens, a Houstonian, began photographing and interviewing many of the people who lived in the vicinity of her family's ranch in western Colorado County. Those people introduced her to others,

and she began flitting around the county, introducing herself to people she thought looked intriguing.

In time, she had amassed a large collection of photographs of and interviews with people from Colorado County. She organized them into a traveling photography show, "Colorado County Memories: Everybody Has a Story to Tell," which was exhibited in libraries and other facilities around the state.

The success of that exhibit prompted her to organize her material into this book, which pairs many of her excellent photographs with portions of the interviews, edited and augmented by Cravens.

The book is divided into eighty-nine mostly short chapters. Each chapter features at least one photograph, and discusses the life of one or more Colorado County residents. Many of the featured people are now dead, including memorable people like Lillie Atkinson, Lonnie Coleman, Jack Gillespie, Hosie Hasty, Lacey Henry, Bennie Isgrig, Dorothy Lain, Truman McMahan, Pie Steward, Stella Taylor, and Hattie and Ethel Lee Wilson.

Most of the people featured in the book are from Weimar, or from the countryside east of Weimar.

Cravens' work has received numerous accolades. Her book also features an introduction by the prominent historian from Rice University, John Boles.
