Airport Hangars To Spur Revenue

venson Services, Inc. of Sealy receives visits from a variety of military officials, who would likely use the new facilities.
The \$113,000 grant, issued through TXDOT's hangar construction program, requires that the city provide matching funds of 25 percent.
In the same vote the council also approved the pursuit of a loan up to \$100,000 to provide the required matching funds.
However, the city will only pursue a loan large enough to cover construction costs.
Business and Community Lenders of Texas, a non-profit lender based in Austin, Texas, will provide the financing.
City Manager Ron Holland serves as president of the board of directors for the organization.
He has been a board member for the past 15 years.

Holland said the construction would also require additional asphalt at the airport. This work will cost approximately \$50,000 with around \$5,000 provided by Eagle Lake in a 10 percent matching arrangement.
Eagle Lake is virtually certain to receive the grant, as TXDOT previously earmarked the funds said Holland.
Assuming that Eagle Lake receives the grant fund, construction would likely begin next spring, with construction taking between 90 and 120 days.
Mayor Mike Morales expressed some concerns regarding the plan.
He said that he felt more concerned about the city's immediate budget concerns.
"We have a number of things to deal with as a city. For example, purchasing a new garbage truck

is likely to cost around \$140,000," Morales said.
In addition, Morales mentioned that he felt the amount of the planned loan was too large and that the city would be better off with the entire city council representing the city in the project rather than allowing Holland to function as the sole representative.
"We want all costs on the table. In the past I've felt like there have been some hidden costs in terms money and manpower. We don't want to get bogged down in the airport project when there are other important things for us to do," said Morales.
