larities between the towns I currently represent [and the new district], there are certainly many differences from the urban areas I grew up in. Therefore I think it's important to come out and see what the special needs of this community are and show that I'm accessible," Doggett said.

Doggett also said that he would work to improve the quality of public education in the district.

In regard to the national stage, Doggett said he wanted to work to make sure the federal government operated with more fiscal discipline while also ensuring that social security and medicare programs remain healthy and in the hands of the government.

"The excessive national debt that we've had these last few years can't be sustained. I serve on the ways and means committee, and also serve on the subcommittee on Medicare, so I want to make sure that they are not privatized and are available for future generations of retirees," Doggett said.

In other court action: --County Judge Al Jamison reported briefly on work to stabilize the ceiling in the district courtroom. He said the cost of that portion of the repair was \$18,500.

He noted that part of the lawn at the courthouse was torn up when equipment was brought in, but said it would be repaired when the project is finished.

--The court granted permission to the Columbus Convention and Visitors Bureau to use Beason's Park and the Colorado County Courthouse square on April 14 and 15, 2007 for their Art, Architecture, and Wildflowers event.

The court also granted permission to the organization to place an interpretive sign on Courthouse Square.

Interpretive signs give information similar to historical markers, but often contain photographs or illustrations.

--The court granted the request of Don Churchill, Branch Manager of the Rio Colorado Chapter of the Red Cross, to park a Red Cross emergency response vehicle in the courthouse circle for one month.

Churchill said he aims to generate publicity of the Colorado County chapter of the Red Cross.

Due to legal concerns the court tabled requests made by Churchill for use of the courthouse mechanical room as well as a computer and telephone.

---The court took no action on adopting a burn ban. Commissioner Darrell Gertson said conditions were not yet dry enough to adopt a ban.

--The court reappointed Dr. Russell Thomas of Eagle Lake for another two-year term as Local Health Authority.

--The court approved the engagement of Rutledge and Crain of Arlington, Texas as outside auditors for 2006.

--The court approved the naming of a private road in Precinct One near Altair as Owen Circle.
