Board Rules Out Nov. Bond Issue

During the Aug. 21 Rice School Board meeting, trustees briefly discussed the possibility of bringing a bond issue to the Nov. ballot.

However, board members indicated they did not want to pursue the idea for the time being.

Several members expressed concern regarding the amount of time and effort necessary to formulate a bond proposal that might not pass in any case.

"The time required to deal with a bond takes time away from academics. My personal feeling

is that it needs to be put on hold," said Rice School District Superintendent Michael Lanier.

Trustees also expressed concern about the feasibility of passing a bond issue so quickly after the narrow defeat in May.

"Coming so soon after the last one, a bond issue might not even pass," said trustee Vivian Spanihel.

However, the board members also expressed a desire to revisit the issue in the future due to the need for improvements to the district's current facilities.

Lanier said that pupils at the facility were closely monitored, agreed to construct a privacy fence separating the facility from neighboring properties, and agreed to route traffic to the facility through the Rice High School campus rather than the adjacent county road.

The new alternative education facility is a portable building erected near the high school

campus.

Lanier advised that the facility generally accommodates around 12 students with discipline problems, and became necessary when the Texas Youth Commission abandoned the Colorado County boot camp facility that the district previously used for the purposes of alternative education.

--The board designated \$1,000,000 of the Rice school

district fund balance for use in improving district facilities.


--The board approved updates to the district's educational plan for the gifted and talented.

--The board accepted the bid of \$66,000 from Public Educators Association of Texas to provide property and casualty insurance for the district.

--The board discussed the status of the former Special Education Cooperative building in Columbus.

The district owns 70 percent of the now vacant building in a partnership with Weimar School District.

Pending agreement from Weimar and legal consultation, the board agreed to investigate leasing the building.
