

Eight Sentenced In District Court

Eight individuals were sentenced in proceedings in Colorado County District Court on Sept. 22 before District Judge Dwight Peschel.

They included:

—Eric R. Belmonte, possession of a controlled substance on Jan. 1, ordered placed on five years probation with deferred adjudi-

cation, \$1,000 fine and 400 hours community service.

—George Wesley Boynton IV, possession of a controlled substance on May 12, ordered placed on three years probation with deferred adjudication, \$1,000 fine, 240 hours community service and \$140 restitution.

—Kayla M. Burley, credit card abuse on April 25, ordered on three years probation, with deferred adjudication, \$1,000 fine and 240 hours community service.

—Jason Cockren, possession of a controlled substance on May 16, placed on three years probation, \$750 fine, and 10 days in jail.

—Justin Amaro Flores, unlawful possession of a firearm by a felon, three charges on July 28, eight years in prison for each charge; burglary of a building on July 28, 24 months in state jail.

—Richard Solis Jr., manufacture or delivery of a controlled substance on April 4, eight years in prison.

—Jermaine L. Williams, possession of a controlled substance on July 29, ordered to serve 365 days in jail.

—Kenneth Broussard, possession of a prohibited substance in a correctional facility on Nov. 2, 2005, probation modified to 30 days in jail on weekends.
