4-H Fruit Starts

Colorado County 4-H members are in the process of holding their annual fruit sales campaign. They are selling Texas Sweet oranges and grapefruit, as well as apples and pears. These are available in several different sizes of boxes and fruit combinations. The fruit is coming from River Star Farms in Mercedes, Texas.

In addition to the fruit, 4-H members will be selling pecans, peanuts, cashews, pistachios, almonds and walnuts again this year.

Items that are available include: raw pecan halves and pieces, flavored and frosted pecan halves, raw and flavored peanuts, cashews, walnuts, pistachios, almonds, trail mixes and a variety of gift sets. These items will be available in 12 oz., 1 lb., 2 lb., 3 lb. and 5 lb. containers. These nuts are being purchased from Durham-Ellis Pecan Company in Comanche, Texas.

Wheat Down 29 Percent

According to the Texas Field Office, wheat stored in all positions on Sept. 1 totaled 60.8 million bushels, compared with 85.3 million bushels a year ago.

This inventory is down 29 percent from last year.

Farm stocks totaled 4.2 million bushels, up .2 million bushels from a year ago.

Off-farm stocks totaled 56.6 million bushels, down 30 percent from last year.

Texas off-farm old crop corn stocks totaled 35.2 million bushels, compared with 22.1 million bushels stored this time last year.

Total old crop sorghum stocks in all positions in Texas, at 8.9 million cwt, were up 22 percent from the 7.3 million cwt a year earlier.

United States corn stocks in all positions totaled 1.97 billion bushels, down seven percent from last year.

On-farm stocks accounted for 750 million bushels, down nine percent from last year.

Off-farm stocks, at 1.22 billion bushels were down six percent from last year.

Wheat stocks in all positions totaled 1.74 billion bushels, down nine percent from a year ago.

Sorghum stocks in all positions totaled 36.5 million cwt, up 14 percent from Sept. 1, 2005.
