

Raiders Beat Weimar

over with excellent field position at the Wildcat 43.

On fourth and three, the Raiders again opted to go for the first down instead of punt.

Foster got the carry, and rambled 36-yards for a Raider touchdown.

Samaniego made the extra point for a 28-0 lead with 6:32 remaining in the third quarter.

Weimar started their next drive on their own 15, but again Rice forced a three-and-out.

The Raiders took over at their own 37, but a penalty on first down pushed them back to the 27.

Foster then broke free for an 18 yard gain, bringing up third and two.

The Raiders put the ball right back into Foster's hands, and he ripped off another 33-yards to the Weimar 22.

Foster got the ball on the next play and picked up another nine yards to the 13.

A penalty pushed the ball back to the 24, where Cook completed a pass to Tolliver for 14 yards and first down at the 10.

On the following play Cook found Williams for a 10-yard score.

Samaniego put the extra point between the uprights making the score 35-0 with 1:11 to go in the third.

Weimar returned the ball to the 47-yard line.

On third and one, Garvin Burley carried the ball for the first down to the Raider 43.

On the next play Quinney completed a 39 yard pass to Steven Maupin for first-and-goal on the four-yard line.

On first down, Burley got the ball and rushed for one yard to three.

Then Jones pushed the Wildcats closer to paydirt with another one-yard carry.

On third-and-goal, Quinney fumbled the ball and Rice's Williams scooped it up and went the entire 98-yards for the Raider's second defensive touchdown on the night.

Rice tried out a trick play on the extra point attempt, but failed to reach the endzone. With

10:13 left in the game the score was 41-0.

The kick off from the Weimar 30 yard line as a result of a 15-yard penalty on the fumble return and another on the extra point attempt.

The kick went through the endzone for a touchdown and Weimar started on the 20.

After a Johnson six-yard carry on first down, Jay Helmcamp completed a 31-yard pass to Maupin to the Raider 43.

A rush for no gain and two incomplete passes made it four and ten.

Quinney then completed a 33-yard pass to Johnson to the 30.

On third down, Quinney threw complete to Marcus Wilkins, but then lost five yards going for the first down on the next play.

Rice took over on downs at their own 40.

Hemphill carried the ball twice for 14-yards to the 44, where the drive fizzled out and the Raiders punted to the 10 yard line.

Weimar fumbled two plays later giving Rice the ball at the Wildcat 15-yard line.

Hemphill picked up 12 yards on first down to the three-yard line.

On third-and-goal, Wesley Arrison pushed the ball into the endzone with 3:06 left in the game. A two-point conversion try failed, making the score 47-0.

Weimar got the ball back on the 40 yard line and managed to push it to the Rice 39 before time expired.


Leading Weimar rusher was Johnson with 53 yards. Quinney finished six of 15 for 113 yards.

For the Raiders, penalties were the main concern coming out of the game with 15 flags for 75 yards.


"We have gotten penalties, but they are hustle penalties the majority of the time," said Dumont.
