## Raider Band In Marching Festival

The Mighty Raider and Columbus Cardinal High School bands will be among the 29 high school bands participating in the 32nd annual Buccaneer Marching Festival scheduled for Oct. 7 at Spencer Stadium at Blinn College in Brenham.

The event is sponsored by the Blinn College Band and was started by Larry Campbell his second year as director of bands at the college.

"This year the event will bring 2,650 high school band members to the campus," said Campbell, who took over the program in 1972.

Bands participating, by classification, are: 1A -- Flatonia and Iola; 2A -- East Bernard, Rice, Somerville, Lexington, Schulenburg, Industrial, Brazos and Hallettsville; 3A -- Columbus, Giddings, Bellville, Rockdale, La Grange, Caldwell, Needville, Cuero, Smithville and Yoakum; 4A -- Brenham, Montgomery, Houston Waltrip and Manor; and 5A -- Round Rock Stoney Point, Fort Bend Bush, A&M Consolidated, Houston Northbrook and Magnolia.

The contest will begin at 9 a.m. with bands scheduled on 15-min-

ute intervals. Rice will perform at 10:30 a.m. and Columbus will perform at 4:15 p.m.

The Blinn drum line will be featured at 12:30 p.m., and the Blinn College Buccaneer Band will perform at 5:45 p.m. Awards will be presented at 6.

The festival gives the bands the opportunity to preview their University Interscholastic League marching show for a panel of judges. Each band receives comments relating to music performance, marching and general effect.

In addition, bands compete for first, second and third place in each classification. Best in class awards are also given to auxiliary groups -- drum major, drum line, color guard and soloist.

This year's judges are Jack Fariss of Pearland, Randy Vaughn of Klein, John Siebern of Houston, Janice Crockett of Houston and Rodney Cannon from Sam Houston State University.

There is no admission charge to the festival and the public is welcome.

"For those who enjoy marching bands it's like seeing 30 half-time shows without a football game," said Campbell.
