Terry was employed as a heavy equipment operator and was of the Baptist faith.

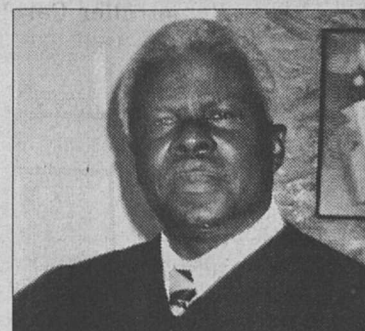
