

Eagle Lake Police Department Report

At 7:10 pm, Deputy Craneck responded to Business Hwy 71

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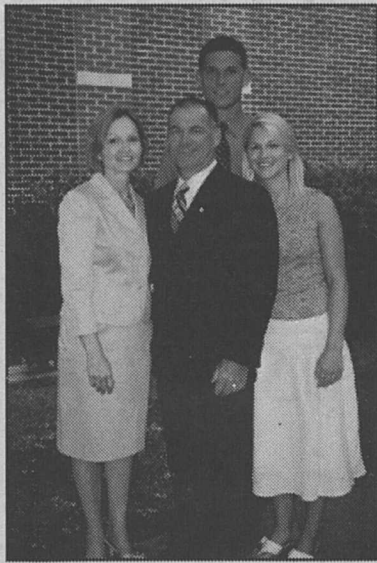
