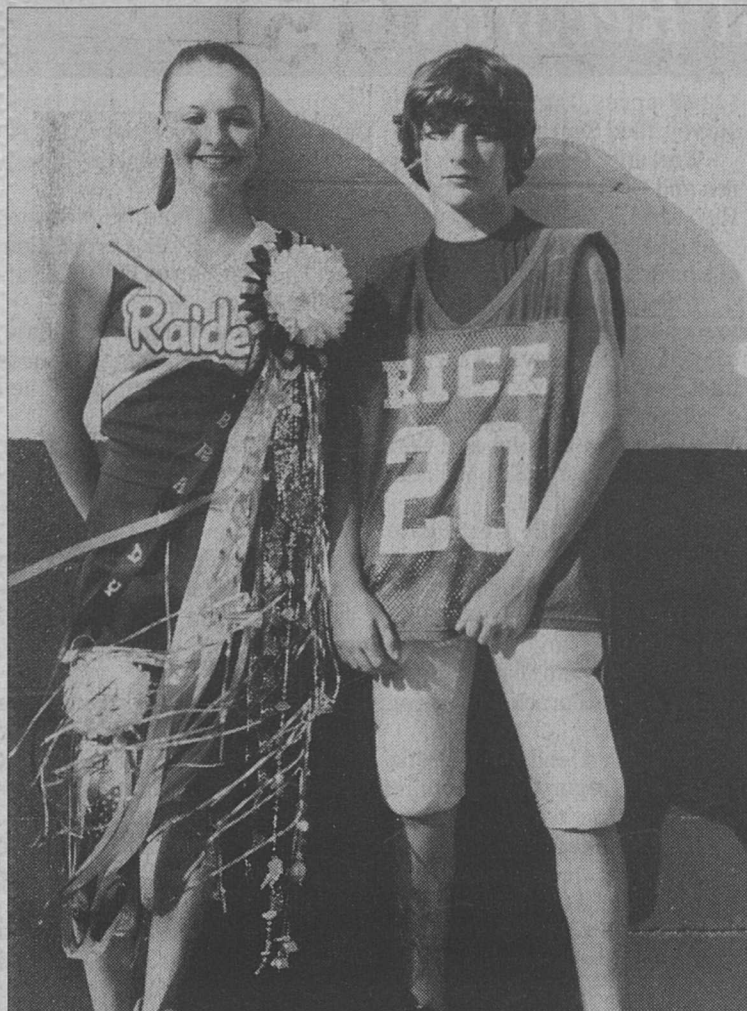

Industrial ran the kickoff back to the Rice 47, and they set up there for their next possession.

A short run was the result of the first play and they followed that with a play action pass for a 35-yard gain to the 11.

They carried the ball twice from here and found the end zone with a six-yard gain.

The extra point was no-good, and the score was 13-6 with 11:54 left in the first half.

Rice returned the ball to the 44 to start their next possession.

Lobpries carried for four yards on first down and Cook threw complete two plays later for 15 yards and a first down at the Cobra 37.

Foster then rambled for 12 yards and 18 yards on consecutive carries to give Rice a first down at the 7.

Cook scrambled for five yards and then ran the quarterback sneak for the score. A two point try was no-good, and the score was 13-12, Cobras with 8:01 left in the half.

Industrial started the next drive at the 44 and took only two plays to score again.

After a one-yard run, they went back to the play action and scored on a 55-yard connection.

The extra point was good, giving Industrial a 20-12 lead with 7:06 left in the half.

Rice's next drive was killed by a low snap that resulted in a 16-yard loss and the Raiders punted from their own 24.

Industrial set-up at the 38, and the Raider defense forced them three-and-out.

Esquivel, Williams, and Damien Stevens got a big stop and second down, and Industrial threw incomplete on third.

The Raiders also went three and out on their next possession and were forced to punt the ball back to Industrial.

The first half came to an end with the score 21-12 in favor of Industrial.

Rice got the ball to start the second half and they started their drive at the 27.

Foster carried twice for four

and 15 yards to the 46.

After two ineffective run plays, Cook threw to Lobpries for an 11-yard pickup.

On fourth down and three, the Raiders opted to go for the first down and handed off to Foster.

Foster looked to have just made the first, but the spot fell just short and the Raiders turned the ball over at the Cobra 45.

On first down the quarterback kept the ball and ran for 38 yards to the Raider 17.

On the next play they ran for seven more, but the Raider defense dug-in and Jasmine Hemphill tackled the quarterback for a three-yard loss on the next play.

Industrial tried two straight pass plays to try to get the first down, but neither was completed.

They turned the ball back over to the Raiders on the 13.

A throw attempt was incomplete on first down and holding was called on second down, pushing them back to the 7.

Cook threw incomplete on second down and scrambled for 10 yards on third, but the Raiders were forced to punt again.

Industrial set up at the 29 following Cook's punt.

On first down, Williams and Brent Botard stopped a run attempt for a short gain.

Esquivel came up with a five-yard sack on the next play, but Industrial followed this with a 16-yard burst for a first down at the 41.

The quarterback kept the ball for five yards and then they ran it for 12 more on the next play for a

first down at the Raider 42.

A late hit penalty was called on Rice after a three yard run, giving Industrial the ball at the 23 with a first down.

On second down a Cobra run attempt scored on a 22-yard jaunt.

The extra point was good and Industrial extended its lead to 27-12 with 1:59 remaining in the quarter.

Rice got the ball at the 20 after a touchback.

Cook threw complete to Toliver on second down for a seven-yard gain.

Cook gained two yards on third down leaving the Raiders a yard short of the first down.

Rice went for it and Foster fought for a six-yard pickup and the first down.

Cook found Sylvester Middleton for a 20-yard gain to the 45.

Then threw complete to Pratt and Toliver for eight and 17 yards to the 20.

Cook then scrambled for 14 yards and then five yards on consecutive plays to push the ball to the one.

Cook then kept the ball on a sneak for the touchdown, the extra point was good to make the score 27-19, Cobras, with 11:06 left in the game.

Industrial started their next drive at the 36.

The quarterback kept the ball for a short gain on first down, but T.J. Danklefs stopped the next play for two-yard loss making it third-and-ten.

The Raiders were flagged for pass interference on the next play

on what appeared to be a very close call. An unsportsmanlike conduct penalty was also called on the Raider bench following the play, giving Industrial a first down at the Raider 34.

The Raider defense once again came up with a couple of big plays.

Danklefs stuffed the first down play for a one-yard loss, and Lobpries, Esquivel and Stevens followed that with a stop for a three-yard loss.

On third and 13, Industrial managed a seven-yard gain, but they were stopped on a fourth down attempt and the Raiders got the ball back at the 30 with about seven minutes left.

Unfortunately for the Raiders, a front came in right about that time and they were heading into a diagonal wind gusting at high speeds.

Cook scrambled for seven yards on first down and threw complete to Toliver on the next play for five yards and a first down at the 42.

Foster carried for two yards on the next play, but the Raiders were unable to get any further, throwing incomplete on the next three plays.

Industrial took over possession with about 5:30 left in the game.

Industrial ran the ball for two, then four yards bringing up a third and four.

Industrial broke loose on a long run down to around the 25 with a little under four minutes left.

At this point rain had begun to fall heavily and lightning looked to be getting closer to the stadium.

The officials stopped the game a few plays later with 2:15 left on the clock.

Defensive standouts for the Raiders were:

Williams, 12 tackles, 4 solo; Suarez, 10 tackles, 2 solo, 2 for a loss; Danklefs, 10 tackles, 2 solo, 2 for a loss; Botard, 8 tackles, 2 solo, 2 for a loss; Lobpries, 8 tackles, 4 solo.



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
