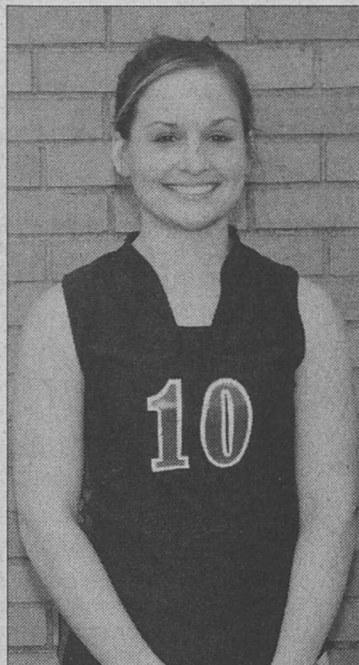




All District Volleyball Teams Selected

yards. Taylor Cook carried the ball for five and three yards and a first down to the 19.

Foster got the call again and carried for 11 yards to the eight-yard line.

A false start pushed the Raiders back to the 13 and Foster carried the ball for six yards to the seven.

On second down, he pushed the ball forward for three more to the four-yard line.

Foster carried again on third-and-goal and got one yard.

The Raiders opted to go for the touchdown on fourth down, but a Cook sneak attempt was stopped short and the Eagles took over at the three-yard line.

Hearne ran the ball on the first two plays and gained two then 15 yards for a first down at the 19.

The quarterback kept the ball on first down for an eight-yard gain and on second down, Pablo Suarez stopped a rush attempt at the line of scrimmage.

The quarterback kept the ball on third down and gained three yards for a first down at the 30.

Hearne threw the ball on the next three plays and picked up 14, 23 and 32 yards to set up first and goal at the Raider one.

The quarterback pushed the ball in from the one for a touchdown.

They opted to go for a two-point conversion and were successful making the score 8-0 with 2:04 left in the half.

The Raiders would strike back quickly.

Brian Williams fielded the ensuing kickoff at the 15 and cut through the coverage team and got to the right sideline and took it all the way back for an 85-yard touchdown return.

Cook threw complete to Marques Toliver for a successful two-point conversion.

The score was tied at 8-8 with 1:51 left in the first quarter.

Hearne returned the next kickoff to the 43 and scored six plays later.

They pushed the ball to the Rice 41 and picked up nine more yards to the 32 on a first down carry.

The quarterback kept the ball on the next play and went 32 yards for a Hearne touchdown.

A pass attempt for a two-point conversion was incomplete and Hearne had a 14-8 lead with 11:10 left in the first half.

The Raiders set up their next drive at the 17.

Ross Lobpries carried for two yards and then Foster for 10 for a first down at the 29.

Cook then carried for nine yards to the 48, but the Raiders were stopped for a three-yard loss on the next play making it third-and-four.

Cook kept the ball for a two-yard gain on the next play and the Raiders decided to go for it on fourth down.

Cook again kept the ball, but was stopped just short of a first down and Hearne took over at the Raider 47.

The quarterback kept the ball for a seven-yard gain and they picked up 18 on the next play for a first down at the 22.

After an incomplete pass and a Hearne penalty, Williams inter-

cepted a pass attempt and the Raiders took over at the 20.

After an incomplete pass, Foster ran the ball for five yards followed by a complete pass for six to Toliver and a first down at the 31.

Cook then hit Darkeith Pratt for 11 yards to the 42.

Foster carried on the next two downs to the 46 and Cook threw complete again to Toliver for 11 more yards to the Hearne 38.

Rice was flagged on the next two plays and faced a first-and-27.

After an incomplete pass and a run for no gain, Cook threw complete to Toliver for 2-0 yards to the 35, making it fourth-and-seven.

Rice was penalized for a false start, but still opted to go for the first down, but a pass attempt was

incomplete and Hearne took over at the 40.

Hearne drove to the 11-yard line on pass plays of 11, 10 and 19 yards where they had a first down at the 11.

T.J. Danklefs stopped the quarterback for a five-yard loss on first down and Suarez pressured him on second down causing an incomplection.

On the next play, Pratt intercepted a pass with 18 seconds left in the half.

The Raiders took a knee at the seven-yard line to run out the clock and head to halftime down 14-8.

Hearne got the ball to start the second half, but Lobpries intercepted a pass and the Raiders got the ball at the Hearne 21.

Cook threw complete to To-

liver for 16 yards to the five-yard line and a first down.

A run attempt was stopped for a three-yard loss and then the Raiders were flagged for an illegal block bringing up second-and-goal at the 18.

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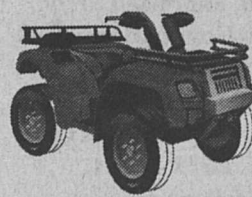
