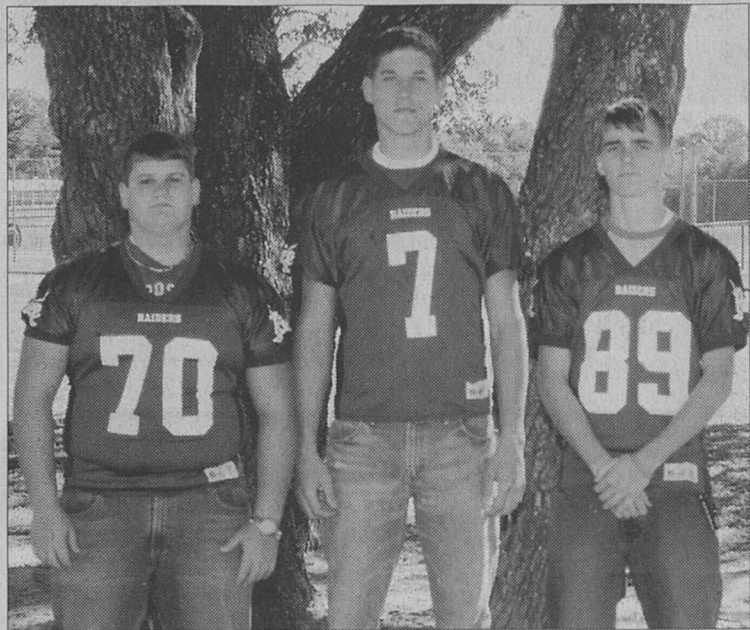
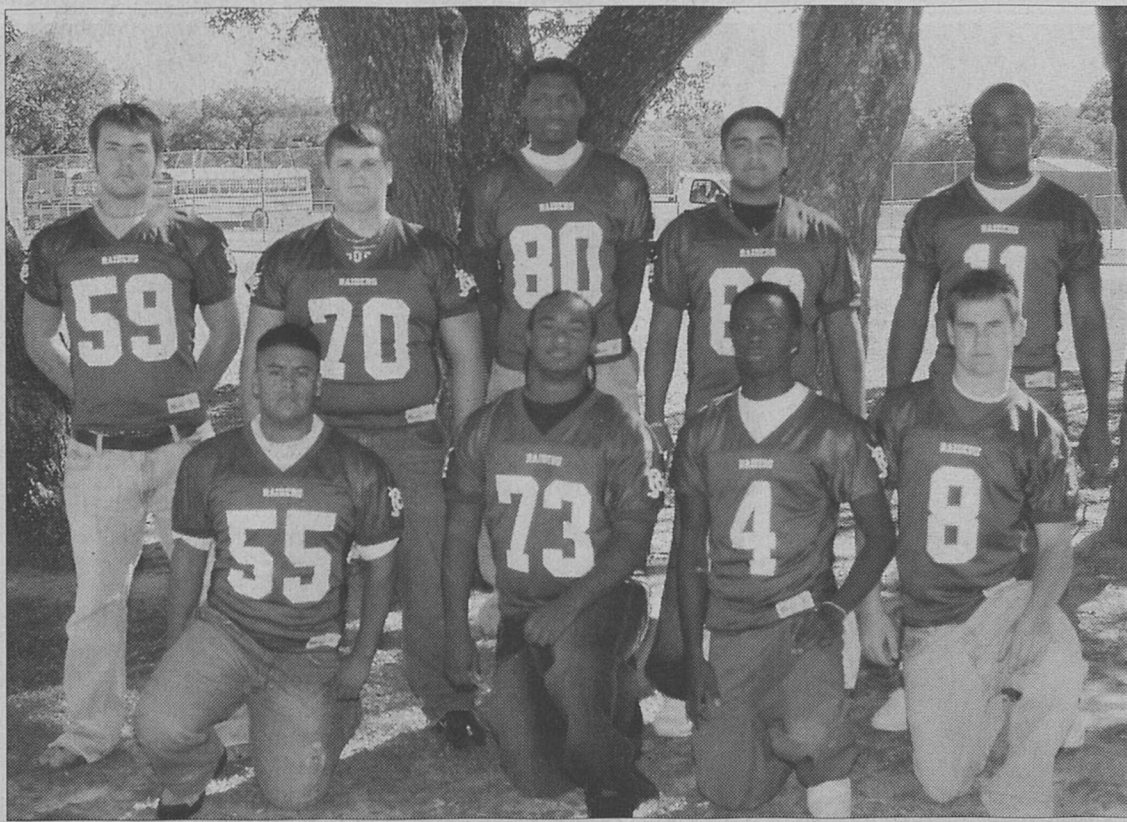

What To Do About Cold Sores

A cold sore is a small blister that usually appears on the outer area of the lip. *Cold sores*, also known as fever blisters, are reddish or purple and may be filled with fluid. This type of sore is different from *canker sores*, which are found on the inside of the mouth. Cold sores are common and contagious, and are caused by the herpes simplex virus. Exposure to this virus may occur some twenty days before signs and symptoms of infection occur. The signs and symptoms of a cold sore usually last from 7 to 10 days. Once a person has had a cold sore, the virus remains inactive in the skin and may reactivate in the same area at a later time. Stress, fever, and exposure to the sun may trigger a cold sore in a person who has previously been infected.

Generally, a cold sore will clear up without treatment in 7 to 10 days. If cold sores occur frequently, antiviral medications are available with a prescription to decrease the duration of the cold sore and also the associated pain. *Abreva* is an over the counter medicine than has been approved by the FDA to shorten both healing time and duration of symptoms. Over the counter pain relievers, such as *ibuprofen* and *acetaminophen*, may be taken to alleviate the pain associated with cold sores.

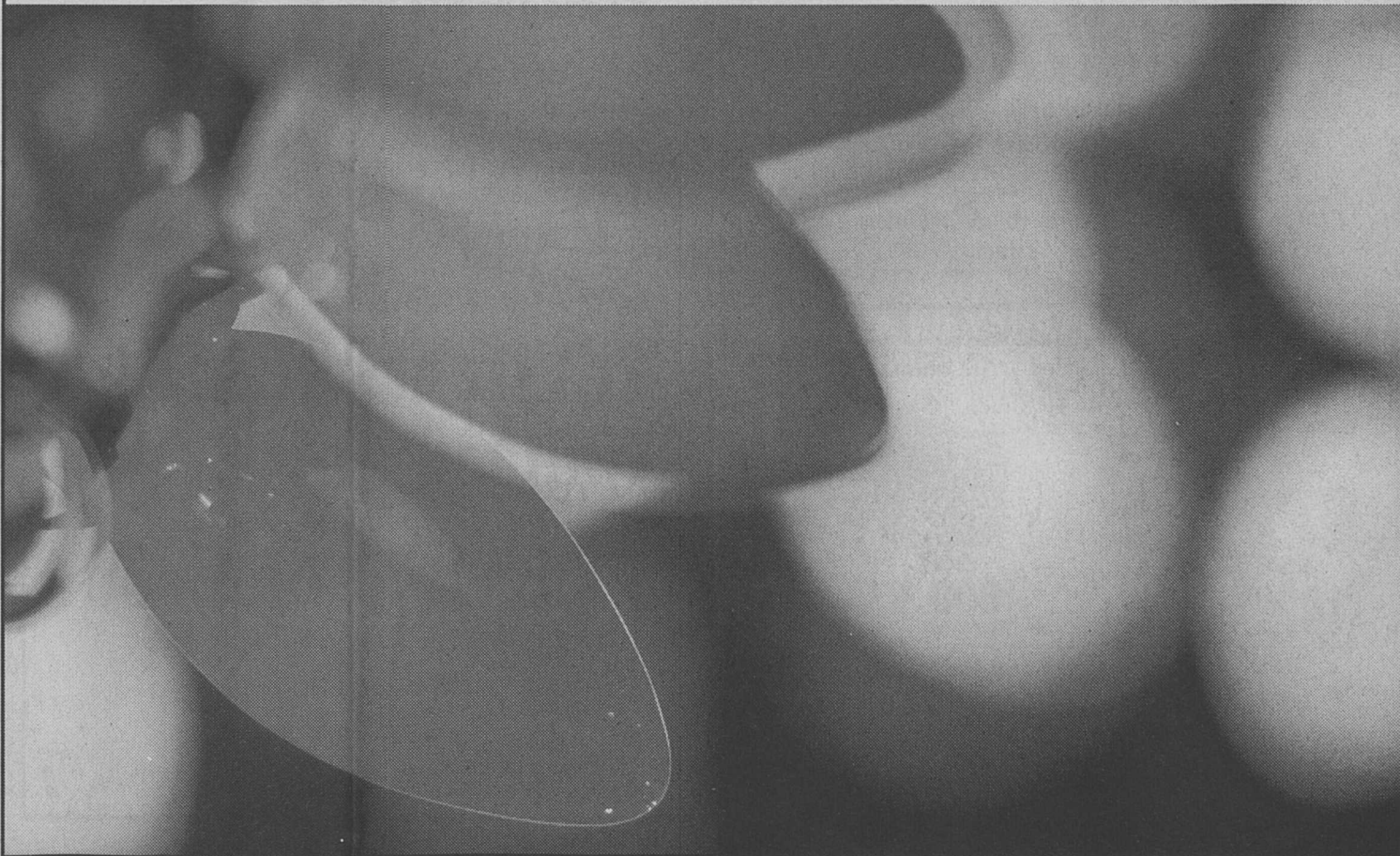
