

Eagle Lake Police Department Report

The Eagle Lake Police Department (ELPD) reported the following calls and cases for the week ending Dec. 10

December 4

At 11 am, Officer Shady Elsabee was dispatched to the 500 block of E. Main St. in regards to a reckless driver. The vehicle was stopped and the driver identified. It was determined that the offense took place in Ft. Bend County. The complainant was referred to Ft. Bend County to press charges.
