SAVE A KNOCKED OUT TOOTH

Q: Is there any way to save a tooth that gets knocked out in an accident?

A: The tooth can be saved, but time is of the essence. If you can get to your dentist within a half hour, the chances of saving the tooth are better than 80 percent.

If such an unpleasant situation occurs, here are some things to remember. Rinse the tooth off with warm water. But don't scrub. You don't want to scrape off the fibers on the root.

Keep the tooth moist by wrapping it in either gauze or tissue dampened with warm tap water. Some recommend putting it back in your mouth under your tongue during the ride to the dentist. Fine. Just don't swallow it.

Best of all, there are liquid mediums available at some pharmacies that you might want to keep on hand for just such an emergency.

You've probably suffered a cut and some bleeding during this ordeal. Hold a cold damp cloth against the wound. Remember, stay calm, move quickly and get to your dentist. You'll have a good chance of saving the tooth.

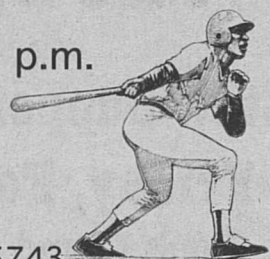
