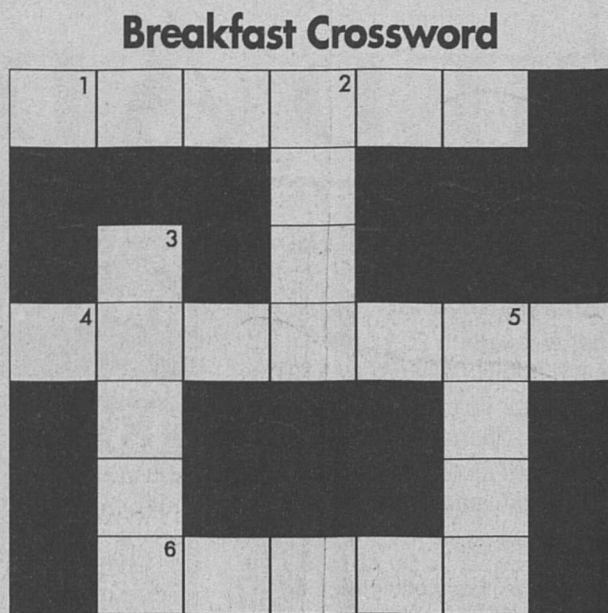

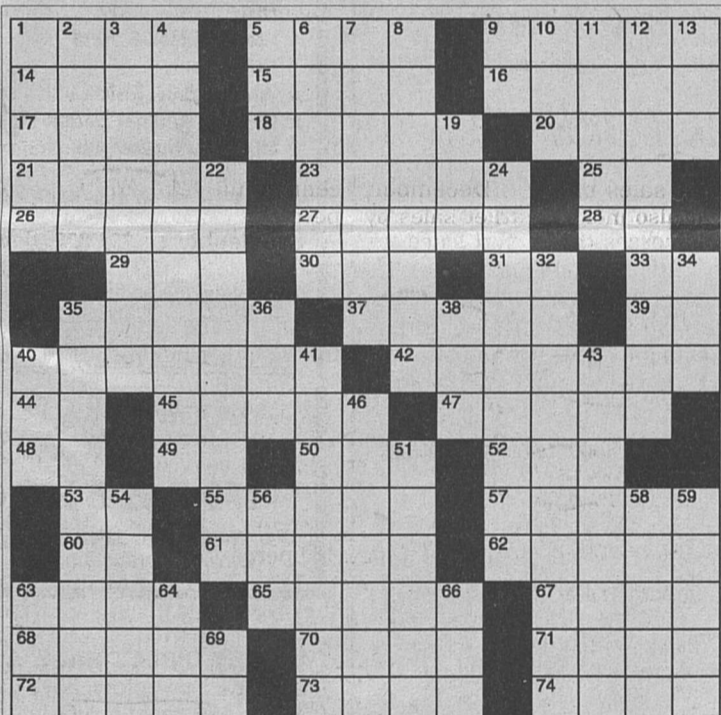

Feral Hog Workshop On Tap Feb. 20

Texas Cooperative Extension has set a Feral Hog Workshop for Feb. 20 in Luling at the Luling Civic Center. Registration for the meeting starts at 8 a.m.

Texas Department of Agriculture pesticide applicator continuing education units will be offered at the program (two General, two IPM and one Laws and Regulations).

Dr. Dale Rollins, Extension Wildlife Specialist and a program coordinator, said feral hogs offer a classic "Dr. Jekyll, Mr. Hyde" situation.

"The purpose of each workshop is to show attendees both sides of the issue," he said.

"We want to offer them the latest information on the subject while giving them options to cope or capitalize on these four-legged interlopers."

"Farmers hate them, hunters love them and ranchers tolerate them," he said.

"Accordingly, the theme fits all these perspectives. Some folks 'value or admire highly' the swine, while others need to 'judge with heightened awareness' or 'be cautiously or sensitively aware of issues surrounding the animals.'"

"For various reasons, feral hogs have become increasingly topical in the past few years.

They've even recently invaded Big Bend Park," Rollins said.

"It's said there are two kinds of landowners in Texas; those with feral hogs and those that will soon have them."

"On the negative side, feral hogs cause crop and pasture damage, tear up fences and consume supplemental feed intended for livestock and deer."

"On the plus side, some landowners have really cashed in on the hunting the animals afford and thus have been able to 'make silk purses out of these sows' ears.'"

Morning topics will be: What's Your Feral Hog IQ, Appreciating Feral Hogs, Feral Hogs in Texas: the Good, the Bad and the Ugly, Feral Hog Status and Distribution in Texas, Feral Hog Biology, Landowner Attitudes on Feral Hogs, and Interactions with Native Wildlife.

Afternoon topics include: Feral Hogs and Their Effect on Water Quality, Controlling Feral Hogs, Hunting Feral Hogs and Laws and Regulations Governing Feral Hogs.

A local landowner panel will also be part of the afternoon schedule.

Pre-registration is \$20 per person until Feb. 16; \$25 thereafter and at the door.

Registration includes lunch, refreshments and handout materials.
