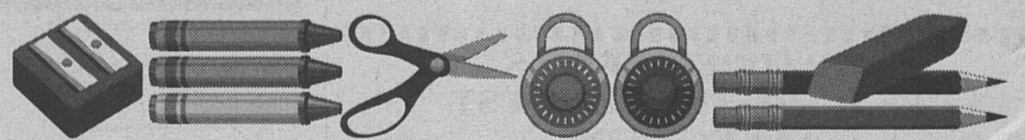

It is the intent of the Rice CISD administration, school board, and employees of the district to provide a multitude of opportunities to each of our students. This week we are focusing on the Eagle Lake Junior High School and the programs offered there to improve the academic growth of our students. We hope this information is useful to parents, guardians, community members, and taxpayers to better understand the activities of the Eagle Lake Junior High School.

Saturday School- Predominately for 7th and 8th grade Math. We do have a few students in 6th grade receiving Math and Reading instruction in Saturday School. Saturday school eligibility is based on either danger of being retained or students who may not do well on standardized tests.

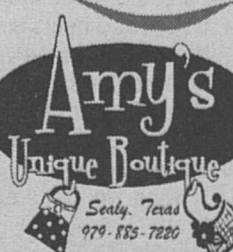
The teachers have very small groups ranging from 2 to 8 students, and instruct the students in whatever way they believe will benefit the student most. (computer lab, using the Smartboard for instruction, or personalized instruction) Instruction is 3 Saturdays per month from 9 to 11 a.m.

Extended day - Should start the week of January 22nd. These classes are for students that are in danger of being retained or do poorly on standardized tests. Instruction is in Reading and/or Writing for 6th, 7th, an 8th grade. The type of instruction is based on student need using a variety of technology applications, as well as traditional approaches and non traditional forms of instruction. (games and activities based on specific learning objectives) Students will attend 2 days per week for 1-1/2hrs. per day. Teachers will be instructing 4 days per week.
