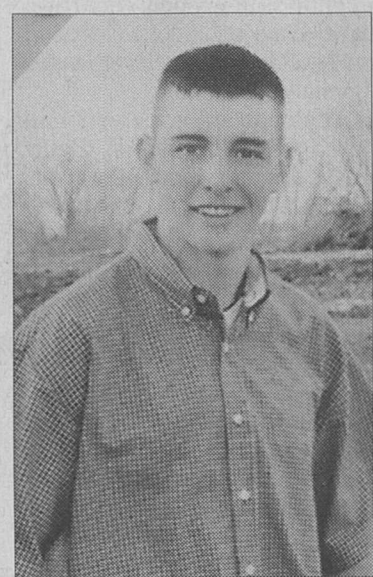

COLORADO COUNTY COURTHOUSE REPORT

Five Civil Suits In District Court

Five civil suits were filed in Colorado County District Court in the last week.

They included:

--On April 19, Louis Sides Trucking Inc. filed suit against Con Rock Ready Mix Inc. in a dispute over payment on an account. The suit claims that \$11,363 is owed on the account.

--On April 20, Tammy Merrill filed suit against Inland Environmental and Remediation LP, involving a workplace fatality at the company's facility in Altair.

The suit claims that Samuel Merrill, the father of the plaintiff, was employed at the facility as an equipment operator. On Aug. 12, 2002, the suit states that he was working to repair a defective hydraulic cylinder on a track-hoe when a wire rope holding the cylinder broke, causing the cylinder to fall, resulting in his death.

--On April 23, Tempest Recovery Services Inc. filed suit against John A. Allen in a dispute over payment on an account. The sum of \$13,787 is claimed to be owed.

--On April 23 Glennon Trojacek filed suit against Robert A. Zajicek. The dispute arises from a survey Trojacek said that Zajicek conducted on the property at 1031 Huebel in Columbus. An error in the survey resulted in Trojacek constructing a building higher than was necessary, the suit states.

--On April 24, Atlantic Credit and Finance Inc. filed suit in a dispute with Craig A. Elstner over payments on an account. The suit states that \$6,211 is owed.
