Frnka Named Granbury Salutatorian

Three members of the Fred R. Frnka family have earned honors of being Salutatorians of their graduating class.

Fred R. Frnka (a grandfather) was Salutatorian of the 32 member Eagle Lake High School Class of 1939.

His son Robert Donald Frnka (a father) was Salutatorian of the 62 member Eagle Lake High School Class of 1967.

Now Richard Frnka (son of Robert Donald Frnka's and grandson of the Fred R. Frnka's) is a member of the 402 member Class of 2007 at Granbury High School in Granbury and he also was named Salutatorian of his class.

Fred R. Frnka, after serving in the U.S. Navy and became a pilot, returned to Eagle Lake and was Editor-Publisher of the Eagle Lake Headlight for 32 years, then served for five years as a Rural Mail Carrier before retiring in Eagle Lake.

Robert Donald Frnka graduated from Eagle Lake High School with the Class of 1967 and from the University of Texas in 1971. He served for a number of years as a pilot in the U.S. Navy and earned the enviable title as a Certified Public Accountant. He is now a pilot for American Air Lines and resides in Granbury.

Richard Frnka, son of the Don

Frnka's and grandson of the Fred R. Frnka's excelled in academics, sports and music activities and he also was named Salutatorian of his class in Granbury High School. He will attend Eckerd College St. Petersburg, Florida to seek a degree in engineering. His class graduates this Friday, May 25 and Richard, as Salutatorian, will be a speaker on the program.

Another grandson of the Frnka's, Joseph Grigar, son of the J.J. Grigars of Lockhart, follows in the footsteps by enlisting in the U.S. Navy to serve his country. He currently is attending an Aircraft Electronics School at the Naval Air Station in Oak Harbor, Washington.

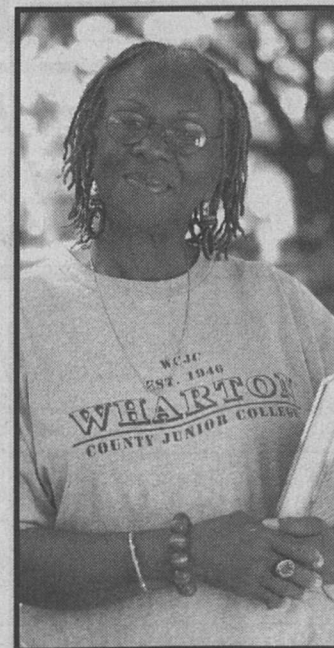
