

# Eagle Lake Police Department Report

## Weimar School Vandal Jailed; Will Pay \$9,000

The first of three adults who spray-painted Weimar school buildings last October was sentenced to 30 days in jail, placed on community supervision for four years, given a fine of \$250 and ordered to pay over \$9,000 of restitution.

Melissa Beyer, 34, of Schulenburg, pled guilty to the charge of felony criminal mischief and was sentenced by Judge Dwight Peschel on May 24, 2007.

She admitted to transporting individuals from Schulenburg to Weimar to spray-paint school buildings.

She was ordered to pay

\$8984.93 to the Weimar Independent School District and \$627.00 to the Lil' Red Schoolhouse for damages caused by spray paint.

Her co-defendants, James Schindler, 18, and Timothy Brown, 24, both of Schulenburg, will be sentenced in the next two months and are expected to receive similar sentences.

They will have joint responsibility for making the court-ordered restitution.

Three juvenile co-defendants from Schulenburg were prosecuted for the same crime in the county juvenile court.

"The Weimar Police Department did a great job in solving this crime and getting these individuals brought to justice," said Colorado County Attorney Ken Sparks.
