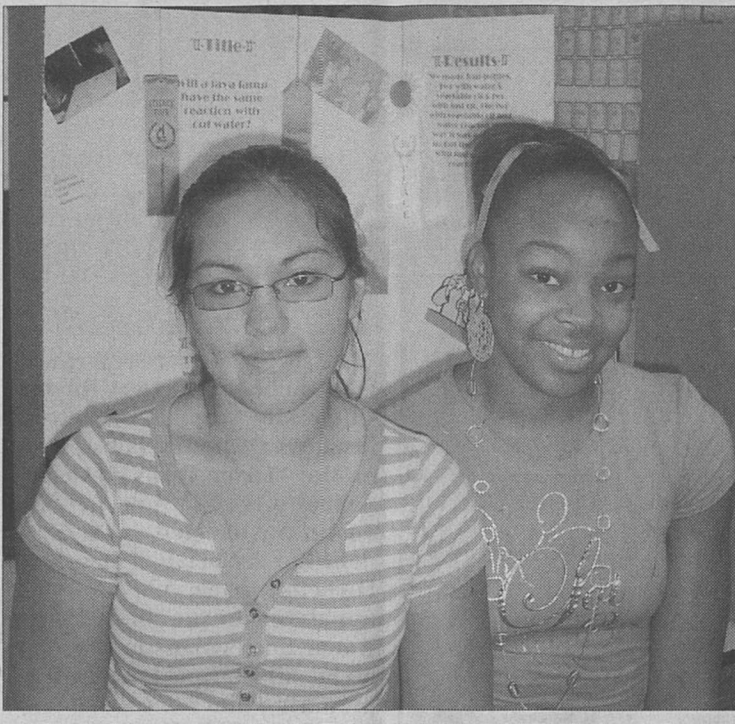

**THE DANGERS OF SODA POP**

Enamel is the hardest substance in the body and it protects the crowns of the teeth, but it is susceptible to demineralization from acids. Acids are produced when certain bacteria colonize on the tooth surface and metabolize carbohydrates, which leads to the development of cavities. Soda pop has emerged as one of the most significant dietary sources of acid capable of producing demineralization of the enamel.

Everyone is drinking more soda pop and drinking it more frequently. Between 56%-85% of school age children consume at least one serving of soda pop each day. At least 20% of school age children consume a minimum of four soda pop servings every day. This has created a public health crisis, which has been recognized by a number of professional associations. ## Blinn To Hold Theatre Workshop

The Blinn College Theater Arts Program is hosting a summer theater arts workshop for high school students on July 7 in the Dr. W.W. O'Donnell Performing Arts Center on the Brenham campus.

The day long workshop begins at 8 a.m. and is offering sessions on acting, auditioning, musical theater, vocal dialect, mask making, stage combat, stage props, lighting, audio editing, computer modeling and scene painting by professionals from Brenham and Houston.

In addition to Blinn theater faculty Brad Nies, theater arts director, and Kevin Patrick, technical director, other workshop faculty will include:

Jim Johnson, who tours nationally as a performer and a dialect coach. He is a professor at the University of Houston and also works with Unity Theatre in Brenham.

Caroline Johnson, who is a professional actress coming off an extended run of "Trailer Park Trash, The Musical."

Chesley Cronin, who has appeared on Broadway as well as at Unity Theater and the Hobby Center's Main Stage.

Jennifer Patrick, who is an assistant instructor in theater at Texas A&M University and does costume design for Unity Theatre.

Nies, who was selected for the Teaching Excellence Award at Blinn this past year, brings 17 years experience as theater arts director. He has also performed at Unity Theatre.

Kevin Patrick is approaching his third year as technical director at Blinn and has appeared in Unity Theatre productions.

Registration for the workshop is \$100 per student and includes a ticket to Unity Theatre's production of "Harvey" that night.
