At 11:15 pm, Sgt. Wiese was dispatched to the 500 block of Keith St. in regards to an unwanted person. The person left when Wiese arrived.

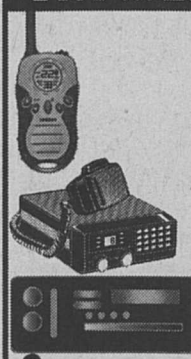
