**Texas Crop Weather Report**

Widespread rain and cooler temperatures were prevalent across most regions of the state with continued flooding in some areas.

Soil moisture was adequate in West and Southwest Texas; however, a surplus of soil moisture was reported in Central and East Texas with the most being in the Upper Coast.

Some fields benefited from the good soil moisture, but many activities were slowed due to wet conditions.

Torrential downpours brought mostly five to 15 inches of rainfall along the Eastern coast of the state with heavy flooding reported in some areas.

East Texas received mostly two to six inches of rainfall.

South Texas received mostly 1.5 to 6.0 inches of rainfall. The Panhandle and Trans-Pecos area received the least amount of moisture with mostly 0.10 to 1.5 inches of rainfall.

Wet soils have continued to cause harvesting problems. Range conditions steadily improved with continued moisture.

Haying and baling were halted in most areas due to the continued rainfall.

Livestock remained in good to excellent condition in most areas of the state.

**Field Crops Report**  
Small Grains: Wheat harvest progressed with excellent yields reported in the High Plains.

There were also reports of high yields in the Low Plains as harvest neared completion.

Excessive moisture in the Blacklands prevented producers from harvesting any wheat with some reports of damage to the crop.

Statewide, wheat condition was mostly good to excellent.

Cotton: The Northern High Plains cotton crop continued to struggle due to cooler temperatures and wind problems.

Warmer temperatures were beneficial to the cotton crop in the Southern High Plains.

Conditions varied in the Northern Low Plains due to planting dates, weather, and available moisture.

Cotton continued to progress slowly in the Southern Low Plains due to cooler temperatures.

Cotton continued to make good progress in South Texas.

Cotton condition was mostly fair to good statewide.

Corn: Cooler and wet conditions in the Northern High Plains were beneficial towards corn growth.

Some areas in South Central Texas experienced problems with nutrient leaching, but seemed to be fine.

Statewide, corn condition was mostly fair to good.

Sorghum: Planting was completed and progressing well in the High Plains.

In the Northern Low Plains grain conditions improved with adequate moisture.

Heavy rains completely halted harvest in the Coastal Bend and Lower Valley.

Sorghum conditions were mostly fair to good statewide.

**Livestock, Pasture and Range Report**  
Continued rains prevented hay harvest in most areas of the state. Cattle were in very good condition in all areas of the state.

Range and pasture conditions continued to improve as a result of the above normal precipitation.

Statewide, range and pasture conditions were mostly good to excellent.
