All contestants must be single and must be residents of the county or attend school within the county.

To qualify for the pageant, contestants for Junior Queen must sell 20 season passes and fair

queen contestants must sell 50 season passes for the 2007 fair.

The fair queen contestant who sells the largest dollar amount of season passes will be crowned membership queen and will receive the \$2000 Pamela Potter Honorary Scholarship and a life membership in the fair association.
