I-10 Wreck Claims Two Lives

Two children, ages 7 and 6, were killed in a one-vehicle accident when a pickup went out of control and overturned on rain-slick Interstate 10 Friday near Columbus.

Killed in the accident were Hannah Greer, 7, of Friendswood and Jozie Beazley, 6, of Bayview.

They were both pronounced dead at the scene by Peace of the Justice Francis Truchard.

Both were wearing seatbelts. The driver was identified as Jennifer Greer-Beazley, 37, of Missouri City.

She was taken to Columbus Community Hospital and later transferred to Brackenridge Hospital.

She was initially listed in critical condition with multiple injuries, including injuries to the head.

According to a report by the Department of Public Safety, the accident occurred about three miles east of Columbus at 12:03 p.m.

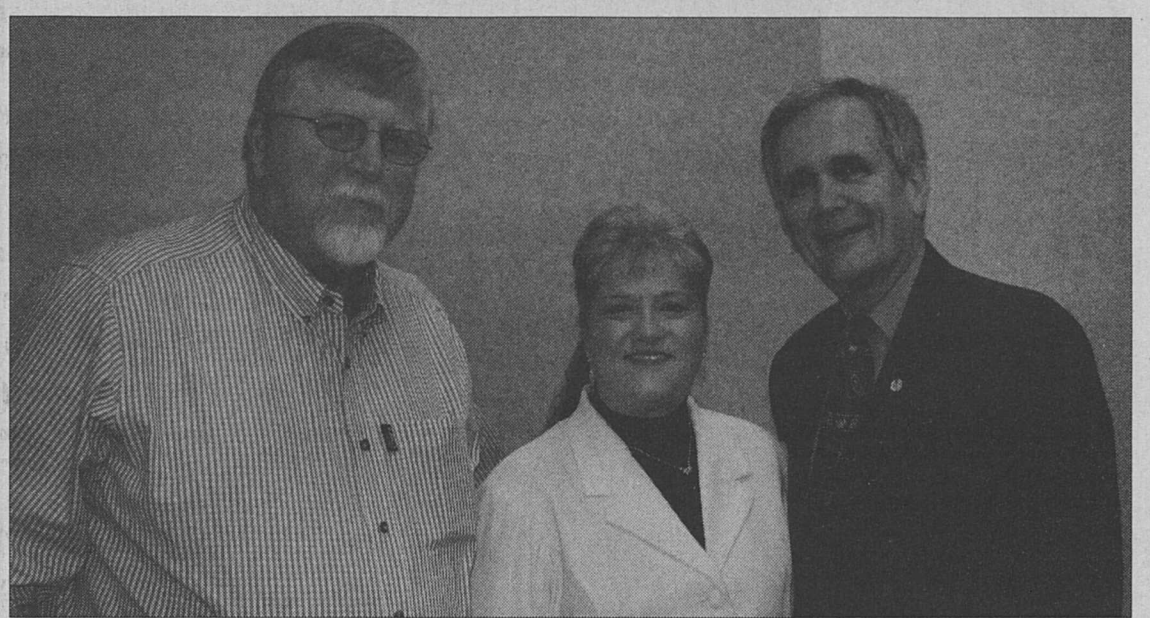
The pickup was traveling west-bound and road conditions were wet and rainy.

The report stated the pickup entered a curve, began to skid sideways, went down a steep embankment and overturned, rolling over several times.

The vehicle stopped on the northbound feeder road.

The accident was investigated by DPS Trooper Kent Tipton, who was assisted by DPS Sgt. Gary Chandler.

Also assisting at the scene were Colorado County Emergency Medical Service, the Sheriff's Department and Columbus Fire Department.

County Looking To Proceed On Repairs

building last week during rains.

He said that water entering the building was particularly heavy in the area of the grand jury room on the third floor, which is under a tile roof.

In addition to the tile, the roof also includes a metal dome.

Jamison said it was possible that repairs could start in March.

Commissioner Doug Wessels said he would like to see a commitment from the state that the county would be reimbursed for funds it spends on the roof.

Jamison said he would do that.

The judge had mentioned paying for the repairs by issuing certificates of obligation, which he said were more flexible than tax notes.

Commissioner Herbie Helm-camp suggested that the county look at taking money from its surplus, rather than tax certificates or notes, which will require a tax increase.

Commissioner Darrell Gertson said he would prefer to have the repairs financed.

Jamison expressed concern about deleting the county's reserve funds.

He noted those were used for

the juvenile boot camp and for the repairs to the district courtroom ceiling.

"It's time to pay up and get this place fixed," he said.

Jamison noted the item was not on the agenda for action and would have to be discussed at another meeting.

In other action, commissioners:

-Approved the same pay scale for election judges and clerks as in the past, \$7 per hour.

-Renewed the county's health insurance and were told that premiums will be increasing 2.4 percent.

-Adopted the retirement plan rate the county will pay for employees for the coming year at 7.66 percent.

-Approved an application to name a private road in Precinct 3 as Peetigrew Lane.

-Amended the budget to provide for \$80,000 for professional services, related to drawing up a master plan for the courthouse.
