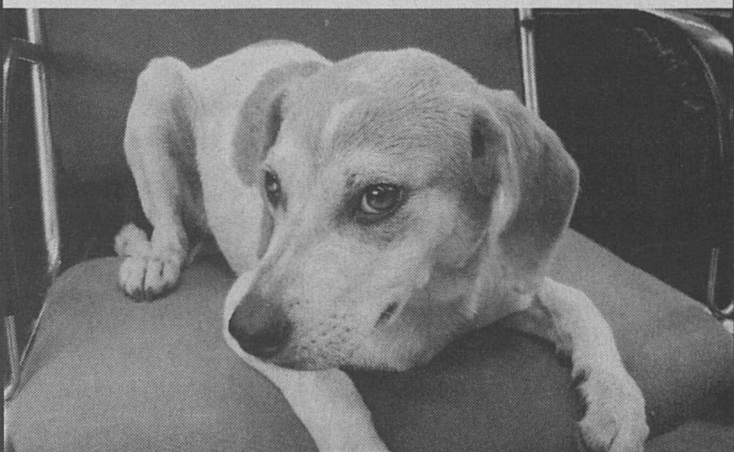

4-H Archery Project To Get Underway

The Colorado County 4-H Shooting Sports Club is sponsoring an archery project beginning on Tuesday, September 4, 2007 at 7 p.m. at the Columbus Junior High School Cafeteria.

The archery project is open to boys and girls, ages nine years old, or eight years old and in the third grade, through eighteen years, throughout Colorado County.
