## Constitution Week Tabbed Sept. 17-23

On September 17, 1787, the delegates to the Constitutional Convention met for the last time to sign their creation, what is now the oldest written and actively used constitution in the world.

More than two centuries after the signing of the Constitution Americans celebrate National

Constitution Week - September 17 - 23, dedicated to honoring and explaining the Constitution, and its role in keeping our nation great.

## LCRA Employees Are Donors

LCRA employees have donated \$17,280 to about 75 organizations in the Central Texas area through an LCRA-sponsored program that recognizes employees for volunteer work in their communities.

Charitable organizations in Austin, Bastrop, Burnet, Colorado, Fayette, Hays, Lee, Matagorda, Travis and Williamson counties received funds recently through the program, called Dollars for Doers. This includes five organizations in Colorado County.

The Dollars for Doers program, which LCRA began in 1996, was created to encourage and recognize employees for volunteerism. LCRA carries out the Dollars for Doers program through a partnership with its customers.

LCRA rewards employees by making a donation to their favorite charity based upon the number of volunteer hours the individuals contribute.

LCRA matches \$2 for each hour an employee volunteers for a maximum of 100 hours per employee.

LCRA employees contributed more than 8,840 volunteer hours during the 12 months that ended

July 1, volunteering at nonprofit organizations in the communities where they live and work.

These organizations provide a variety of services such as programs for the elderly, food, clothing and shelter for underprivileged individuals and families in need of assistance and youth programs such as Little League

and Boy and Girl Scouts.

Other organizations provide medical research and assistance programs such as The American Cancer Society's Relay for Life, fire protection through volunteer fire departments, cultural and environmental programs, educational assistance programs and animal protection programs.

### PREVENTING SENSITIVE TEETH

Good oral hygiene is important in reducing and preventing sensitivity. A soft-bristled toothbrush is best. Avoid brushing too hard - this can wear down tooth enamel and cause exposure of root surfaces and sensitive areas. Also, the ingredients in whitening or tartar control toothpastes may cause tooth sensitivity in some individuals.

Good nutrition can help protect teeth, too. Foods rich in calcium and Vitamin C are good for gums and the bones that support teeth. And, don't smoke. Smoking is linked to gum disease, which can cause gum recession and exposure of sensitive tooth roots.
