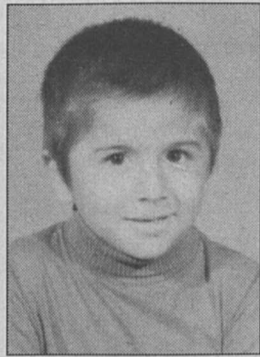

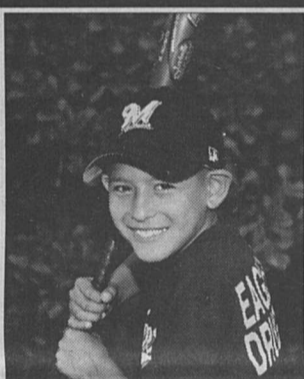

This is a true story of triumph over tragedy about Donna Kunz of Columbus, niece of Helen Supak of Eagle Lake.

Throughout her teenage years and into her adult life, Donna possessed a strong work ethic and an amazing personality.

Working two jobs while attending nursing school, Donna proved to be a team leader, outgoing and independent.

Donna is truly passionate about helping others in need and never complaining. Little did she know she would be the one in need and again, not complaining!

Donna Swenson married the man of her dreams, James Kunz, in Oct. 2000.

Early in 2001, she and James discovered they were going to be parents and life could not have been any better. In July 2001, while working in her flowerbed, Donna became ill.

James rushed her to the emergency room and within a few hours, Donna was on life support due to an Arterioventricular Malformation (AVM) rupture.

Most people in this situation do not survive, but Donna did!

She quickly found herself trapped in a body that would no longer function as before yet, she was miraculously still pregnant.

In Jan. 2002, unable to walk and barely speaking, Donna delivered a healthy baby girl named Bryn Auburn.

Bryn's only abnormality was club feet and they have since been corrected.

Unable to care for her newborn, James' aunt took early retirement and moved in to help the first year.

Donna's goal in life is to be a great and functional mother and wife.

Not accepting life as it is now, Donna expects more out of her life. Through intensive therapy, determination and family support, Donna can now do some things independently.

Fortunate to have insurance, the past five years has had a tremendous financial impact on the family.

They moved closer to town and

purchased a double-wide mobile home. However, their home is in a state of major disrepair.

There is mold and holes in the floor from rotten pressboard that prohibits use of an electric wheelchair indoors due to the weight.

It has since become a safety hazard due to Donna falling into the holes. Fortunately, James was there to help.

The lights flicker indicating some type of electrical problem and Donna can not enter most of the rooms in her home because doorways are not wide-enough for her wheelchair.

James works a full-time job during the day, takes on side jobs for additional income, cares for Donna and Bryn, as well as doing the household chores. When James is unable to assist, Donna has difficulty taking care of herself and Bryn in the present surroundings.

Unfortunately, Donna would not be able to get out of her home in case of a fire or other emergency!

This family has demonstrated the true meaning of commitment, hard work, determination, faith, inspiration and devotion.
