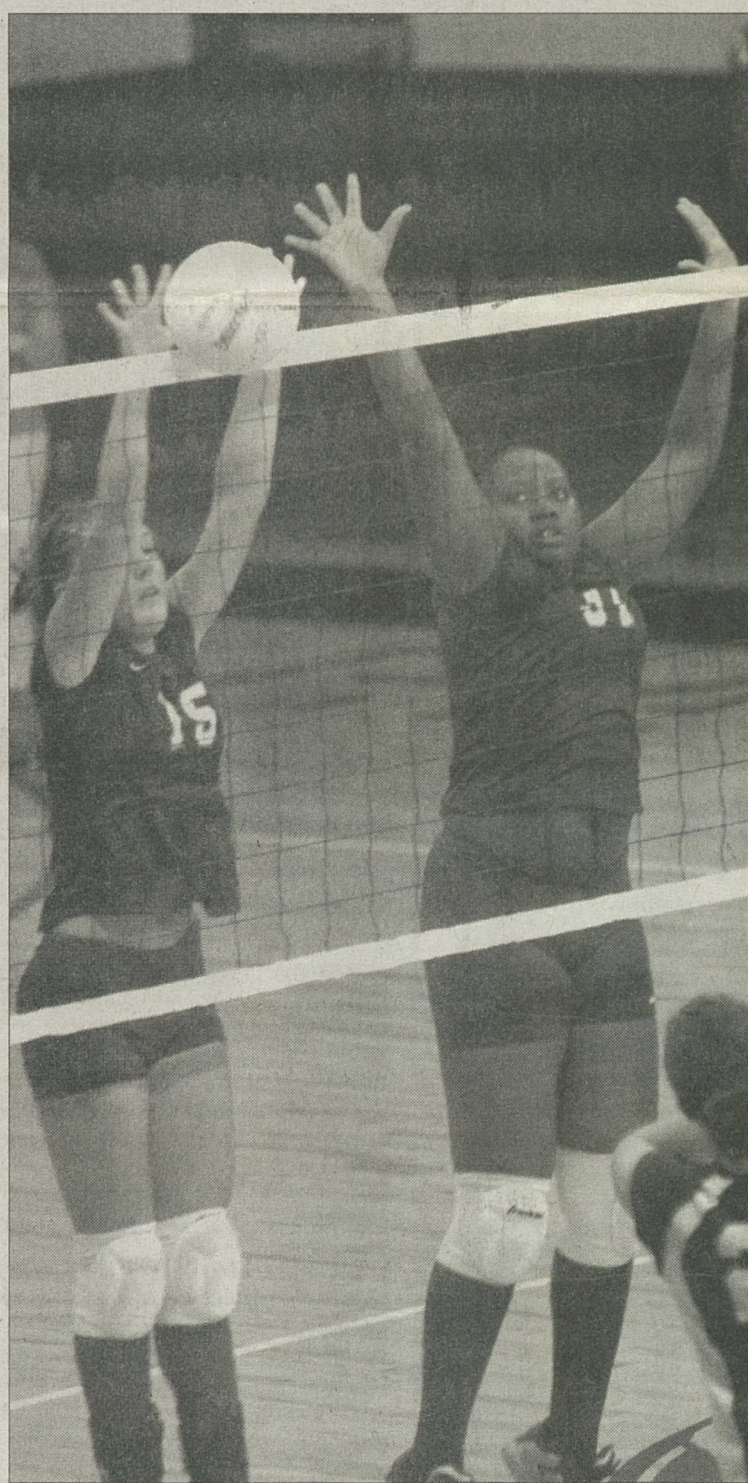
Fifth and sixth grade girls will start practicing once a week in December and will play first in the little dribbler league starting in January.

Some of the girls will be chosen to play Baby AAU after the little dribbler season. This usually runs March to August.

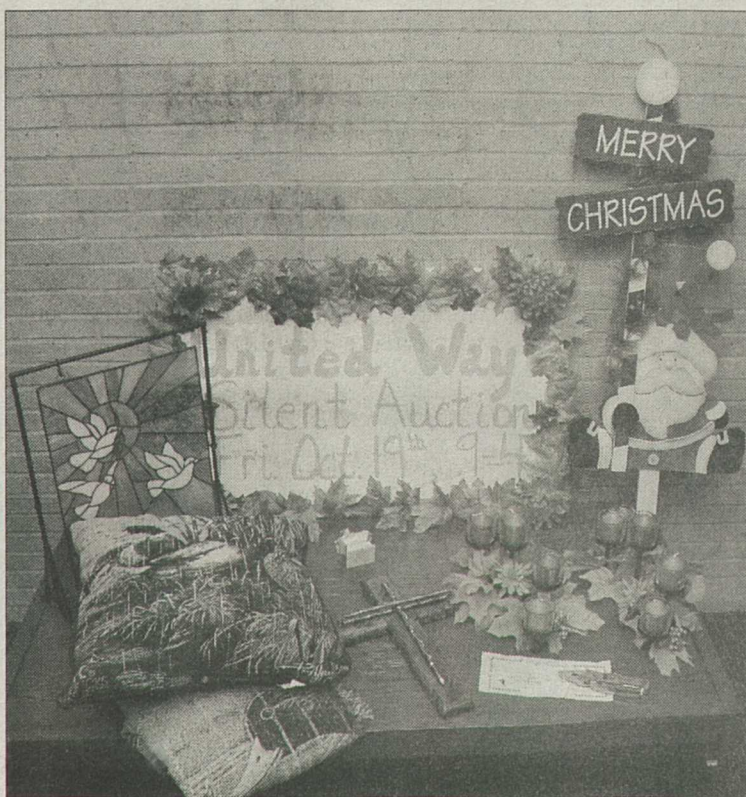
The 7th and 8th grade girls will start right after their junior high season ends. Their AAU season also runs from March to August.

Tournaments are flexible and usually do not interfere with any other sports activities. Please only serious individuals respond

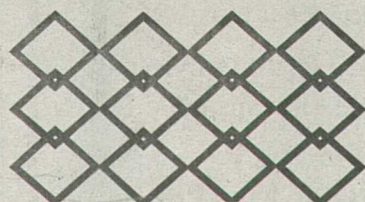

Citrus Production Forecast Down

The October 1, 2007, Texas grapefruit production is forecast at 6.8 million boxes for the 2007-2008 season, down 4 percent from last year's 7.1 million boxes.

All orange production is estimated at 1.8 million boxes, down 9 percent from last year but 13 percent higher than the 2005-2006 utilization, reports State Director, Dave Abbe.

Early and midseason oranges account for 1.45 million boxes and Valencias for 350,000 boxes.

The production of all oranges totaled 2.0 million boxes last season.

United States grapefruit pro-

duction is forecast at 36.5 million boxes, down 5 percent from last year.

All orange production is forecast at 228.1 million boxes, up 29 percent from last year.

MEDICAL HISTORY AND YOUR DENTIST

One very good reason to share your medical history with your dentist is to help your dentist keep you from getting sick. Many people have chronic, but manageable, health conditions that require medication. Your dentist should know about potential interactions between medications you may need for your teeth and other medications you are taking. Some medications negate or minimize the effects of others.

Antibiotics are sometimes prescribed before certain dental procedures to prevent bacteria from accumulating on defective heart valves or joint replacements.

Be sure that you provide your dentist with your complete history, including any over-the-counter medications you are taking.
