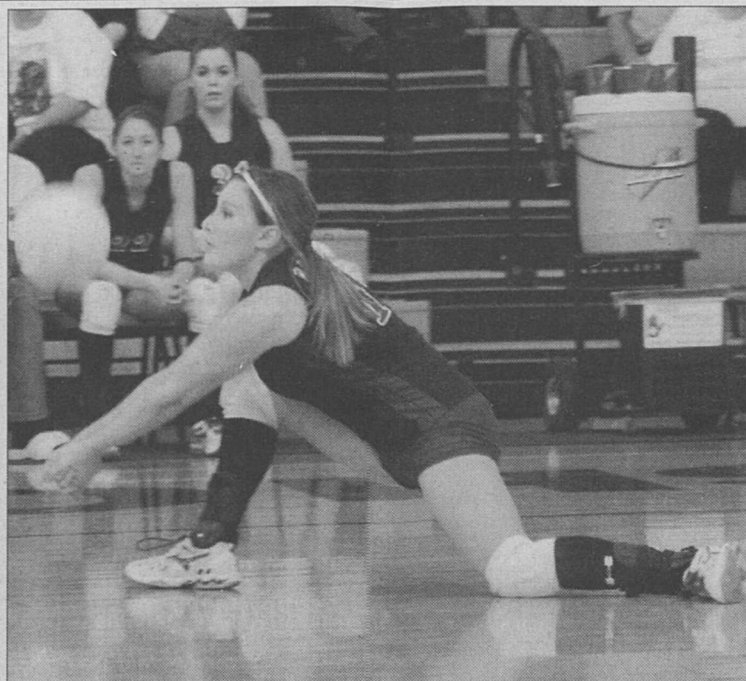


Kaci Kazmir, left, and Brittnee Stevenson block against Schulenburg.

## Lady Raiders Win Two Straight Matches

The Lady Raider varsity volleyball team won two in a row against Industrial and Schulenburg.

Scores for the Industrial game were 24-26, 25-19, 25-15 and 25-17.

Stats for the game are as follows: Kaci Kazmir, 21 kills, three aces, eight digs, seven blocks; Hillary Johnson, two kills, 47 assists, one ace, 15 digs, two blocks; Kristyna Lobpries, one ace, 19 digs; Kourtney Korenek, three assists, one ace, 17 digs; Lauren Shimek, five blocks; Brittnee Stevenson, nine kills, one assist, seven digs, four blocks; Shelly Myres, 20 kills, nine digs, eight

blocks; Jessica Hill, two kills, one ace, one dig, two blocks; Amber Huvar, two kills; Kaydi Gold, six digs.

The Lady Raiders won against Schulenburg, 25-22, 19-25, 22-25, 25-19 and 15-12.

Stats were Kazmir, 20 kills, one ace, 11 digs, 11 blocks; Johnson, one kill, 41 assists, 11 digs, four blocks; April Pagel, 10 digs; Lobpries, 16 digs; Korenek, 15 digs; Shimek, two digs, three blocks; Stevenson, four kills, two assists, six digs, two blocks; Myres, 27 kills, one ace, nine digs, 13 blocks; Huvar, three kills, two digs, three blocks; and Gold, one ace, 12 digs.

## JV Raiders Defeat Schulenburg

Rice JV Raiders played Schulenburg's JV this last at home and came out of the contest with their sixth win of the season. This now gives the JV a season record of 6-0-1.

Once again the defense had a good game and stopped the Shorthorns from scoring. On Schulenburg's first possession Timothy Morales got the first of his two interceptions.

Timothy had a twenty-yard return giving the Raiders the ball on the fifty-yard line. The Raider offense was unable to capitalize on this turnover but would later in the game.

Near the end of the first quarter Terris Shorter would scoop up a fumble and return it for fifteen yards. The Raiders took full advantage of this turnover as Michael Scott capped off the possession with a two-yard run into the end zone.

Ryan Moore would then connect with Terris Shorter on a pass for the extra point.

There would not be any scoring in the second quarter as the Raider offense struggled as both Tillman and Moore threw interceptions.

The defense managed to continue stopping the Horns as Mi-

chael Scott got a sack and then Timothy Morales got his second interception. The first half ended with the score 8-0.

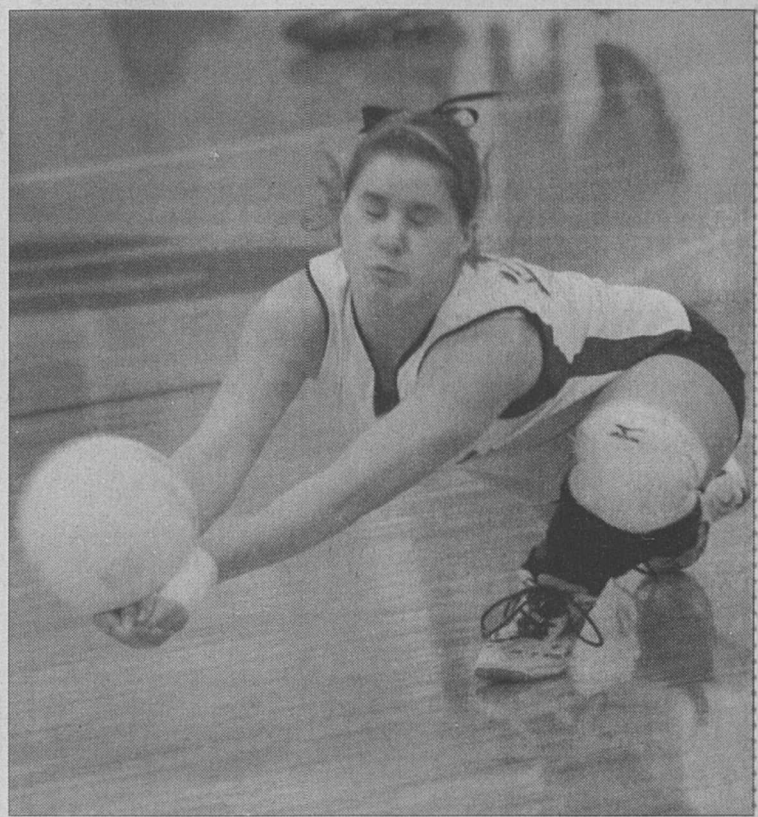
The Raider defense would pick up in the third quarter where they left off in the second and would not allow the Horns to score.

Terrance Shorter would get a sack and then Erik Gold would recover a fumble on the Horn's 35-yard line setting up the Raider's second and final score of the night.

The touchdown would come on a run by Michael Scott. The extra point try failed and the Raiders went into the fourth quarter with a 14-0 lead.

The only other scoring in the game came late in the fourth quarter. After Steven Hafferman recovered a fumble deep in the Raider's end of the field.

The Raiders decided to take as much time off the clock as possible while making Schulenburg use up their timeouts. The Raiders then took a safety so they would kick from the twenty-yard line. The defense again kept the Horns from scoring. The final score was 14-2. The Raiders next game will be in Hallettsville next Thursday at 6 p.m.



Kristyna Lobpries goes for a dig during the game against Schulenburg.

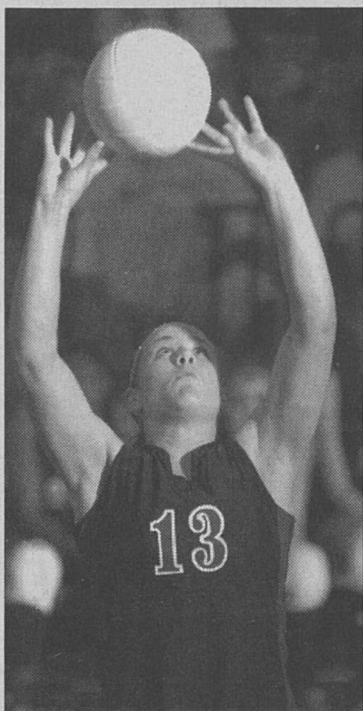
## Fr. VBall

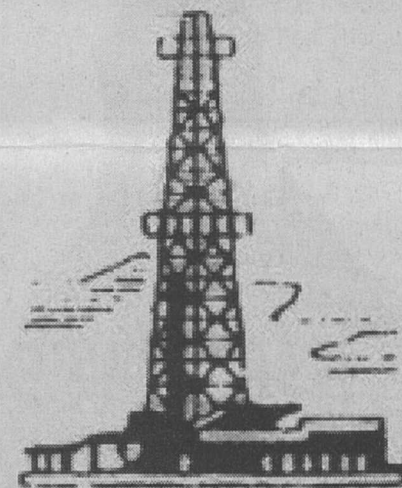
