If in doubt, she says, just don't cash the check.

She said that there have not been many recent problems with fake checks and that this is probably one of the largest amounts isolated to a single location in recent memory.

Lt. Alley said that a few years back there was a fake check scam that came through town and ended up being tied to a Nigerian organization. She said that case ended up being handled by the secret service.
