

# Eagle Lake Police Department Report

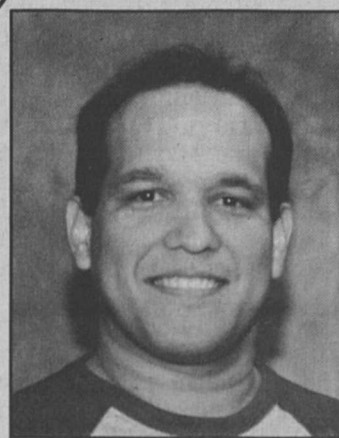
