derful opportunity to showcase her talent on a national stage at the NATS convention."

Lester is no stranger to professional performances. Recent appearances with the Houston Grand Opera include the role of Pepik in "Cunning Little Vixen" and the Bridesmaid in "Le Nozze di Figaro." She has also appeared with New York's Berkshire Opera performing in the role of Miss Pinkerton in "The Old Maid and the Thief."

The soprano singer holds a Bachelor of Music in vocal performance from Baylor University, a Master of Music in vocal per-

formance from the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music and a Doctor of Music in vocal performance from Florida State University.

Other awards for Lester include first place and the audience choice award in the International Meistersinger Competition in Graz, Austria, second place in the Orpheus Vocal Competition and a regional finalist in the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions.

Dr. Paul Spellman, chair of WCJC's division of communications and fine arts, praised Lester as a "wonderful instructor who is loved by students."
