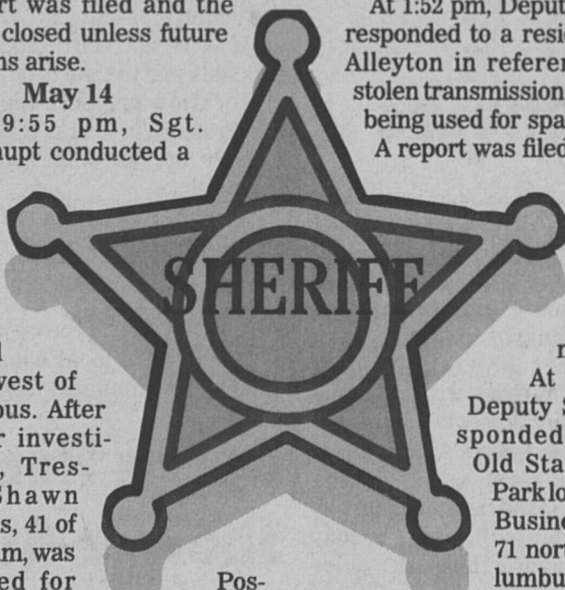

THE DANGERS OF SODA POP
